Objective

- To try and develop creativity, critical thinking and imagination in the students.
- To let student, enjoy and engage with their mates in college.

The Event

The Faculty of Law Organised a Extension Lecture related to Forensic Science. Dr. Girish Kumar Mathur, Worked as forensic scientists for **about 35 years** in State forensic Science Laboratory of Rajasthan who gave knowledge about Forensic science and its relation with law to our students. In his lecture he discussed that Forensic science is a discipline that functions within the parameters of the legal system and may have a remarkable contribution in supporting justice in crime investigation and other serious violations. Its purpose is to provide guidance to those conducting criminal investigations through the recognition and retrieval of evidence at crime scenes and accurate information on which they can rely on the resolution of criminal and civil disputes. Crime includes murder, rape, accident-related incidents, undisclosed persons, displaced persons, fraud-related cases, and forgery. Forensic Science is described as "applying science to statutes enacted in criminal justice by law enforcement agencies." Forensic Science is concerned with the application of scientific concepts and methods of the various science disciplines to legal matters. The proof analysis consists of multiple areas such as sociology, physics, forensic chemistry and biology, DNA profiling, computer science, and engineering. Physics, for example, is used to understand the blueprint of a blood dispersion; biochemistry seeks to strengthen the basis for an unverified suspect, and chemistry helps us to find out the chemical composition of different drugs.

Forensic science is an integration of nearly all scientific skills and acts as a critical and qualified tool that makes the dispensation of justice possible in criminal, civil, legislative, and social contexts. It helps to describe all of science's applications in addressing the questions of legal significance. Forensic science is now a highly advanced research method used in criminal and civil investigations, able to address critical questions and an integral part of the criminal justice system. It includes all renowned techniques such as the analysis of fingerprints, DNA analysis, ballistics and explosives, firearms, culture, etc.

The legal system clearly understands the role that forensic evidence plays in criminal trials. This is because there isn't much room for bias or discrimination while using scientific techniques and methods. This is why profiling of DNA and a variety of other forensic evidence are commonly recognized in courts around the world. Interestingly, the Chinese

(650 A.D.) dates back to the first forensic technique ever used that involved finger and palm print recognition.

Forensic testimony is commonly used across the world for both convicting and exonerating suspects. Thus, forensic science labs have been mushrooming across the globe over the past few decades. In addition, Special Acts have been passed to enhance the delivery of forensic services in the US, Canada and Australia. This ensures greater certainty in the detection of crimes, and consequently, rates of conviction may increase. Such Acts place great emphasis on timely and high-quality crime scene management.

The forensic proof is often used for both defendants who have been convicted and acquitted. As a consequence, the number of crime laboratories throughout the world has increased significantly over the last couple of decades. Special acts have been implemented in the United States, Canada, Great Britain and Australia in order to improve the forensic status of criminals and thereby enable convictions to increase. They stress the timely and quality management of the crime scene. In 1878, India set up the first official crime lab. Around 35 forensic labs now in the country are limited to unique facts. The growing rank and file in the field of forensic sciences and the fundamental role forensic evidence plays in numerous criminal cases has driven up the increase in the numbers of criminals laboratories. A constantly evolving world raises the burden on law enforcement agencies to collect better facts. The news media highlight the importance of forensic science but also focus on errors in locating and identifying in high profile cases.

Expert testimonials offer an important informational source in international criminal proceedings, and forensic expertise is no exception: the ad hoc trials and judgments have been based on findings from exhumations and examinations. While issues relating to the relationship between law and science have been explored within the domains of national judicial systems, the mixed court system presents a solid debate with new contexts. An officer with further forensic studies could be overconfident and unintentionally taint evidence, making it inadmissible. Instead, given the current lack of adequate collection of substantial evidence from the crime scene (if not trampled underfoot and completely ignored), proper training will be more likely to improve the situation rather than worsen it, if competent forensic science instructors are able to carry out it. In the Indian case, greater focus was put on the use of these technologies in criminal investigations and trials. Commissions appointed on criminal justice reforms have affirmed that the introduction of crime detection technologies will enable the system to work efficiently. The related laws have been changed from time to time to make room for the use of forensic technologies in investigating and prosecuting crime. And yet, it can be argued that the regulations that need to be revised have current flaws. Also, due to their conservative approach, the courts are reluctant to rely on empirical evidence, or other inherent flaws in the evidence presented in court, which prevent them from relying entirely on it. Criminal justice system's primary motto is to have equal justice. The forensic proof is, no doubt, more credible than eye testimony.

Being a scientific method, forensic science is a boon to the criminal justice system. To progress, we need to overcome the existing flaws. Around the same time, there is a need to ensure that law enforcement and investigative agencies once again understand and use forensic science as a holistic problem-solving resource to their full potential. It is apparent

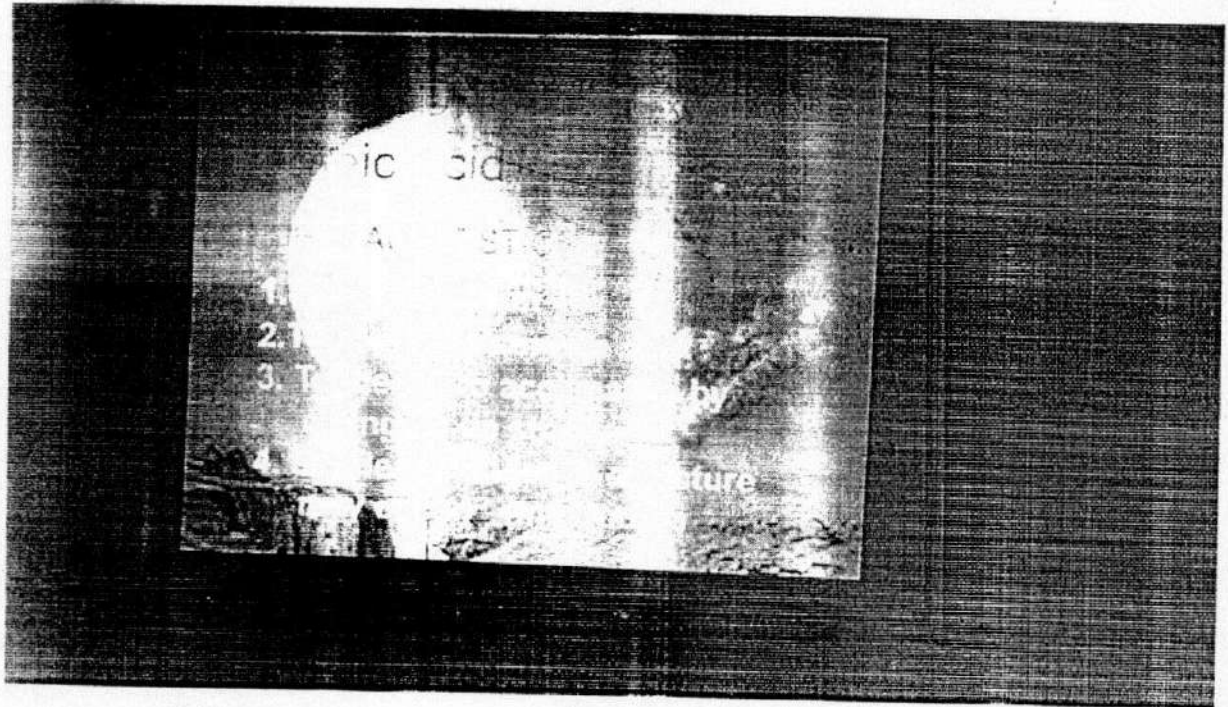
that such a technique is incorporated within a context that enables an understanding of the input that a particular form of evidence may provide meaningfully in terms of sub-source, source, operation or offence-level proposals for a given collection of case-specific circumstances rather than restricting it to a one-dimensional reactive procedure. An interpreted means of evaluative monitoring of forensic science data pertinent to a specific case but retained in the context of that case where alternate solution propositions can be attended to and challenged correctly, works to fulfil this problem-solving prospects. The Event

The event comprised of critical thinking and aiding students in understanding how the proceedings go into the court. The event was full of zeal and excitement. The event was scheduled from 10:00 am to 1:00 p.m. A **moot court** is an extracurricular activity in which students take part in simulated court proceedings, which usually involves drafting memorials or memoranda and participating in oral argument. The term "moot" traces its origins to Anglo-Saxon times, when a moot was a gathering of prominent men in a locality to discuss matters of local importance. The modern activity differs from a mock trial, as moot court usually refers to a simulated appellate court or arbitral case, while a mock trial usually refers to a simulated jury trial or bench trial.

Moot court does not involve actual testimony by witnesses, cross-examination, or the presentation of evidence, but is focused solely on the application of the law to a common set of evidentiary assumptions to which the competitors must be introduced. In most countries, the phrase "a moot court" may be shortened to simply "a moot" and the activity may be called "mooting". Participants are either referred to as "mooters" or "mooties".

Faculty of Law organized an intra semester moot court competition of III, V, VII and IX semester at moot court room between 10:00 am to 1:00 p.m. 14 students participated from all semesters. The round was judged by law faculty Dr. Suman Paliwal and Mr. Abhishek Bishnoi. It was a knowledgeable and learning experience for students. Inter Semester Moot Proposition

Smt. Sukanya vs. Arihant

Facts:

Respondent filed an application for divorce on the ground of cruelty alleging that because of the various acts of cruelty on several occasions perpetrated by the appellant, the respondent-husband was under apprehension that it would not be desirable and safe to stay with the appellant and to continue their marital relationships. Furthermore, the appellant was a convicted criminal.

It was, inter-alia, stated in the divorce petition as follows: "Parties got married according to the Hindu religious rites on 17.4.1999. The appellant's father was an employee in the Railway department and the appellant used to make frequent demands of the respondent for money and used to quarrel when money was not paid. She did not even provide food to her husband or the children and used to threaten the husband to falsely implicate him in a case of dowry demand or under the Domestic Violence Act, and to kill the children and to put the blame on the respondent-husband and his family members. On 23.10.2008 she took Rs.1,05,000/- from the respondent and acknowledged the receipt of the money in the diary of the respondent-husband. She used to borrow money from time to time from others on behalf of her husband at the behest of her parents. From the wedlock four children were borne namely, Neha, Anu, Khemraj and Vishnu Sagar. The appellant used to keep the children tied by ropes and she attempted to throw them down from the rooftop and used to physically torture them. She was temperamental, very cruel and used to behave cruelly with the children as well to cause pain to their father. She always used to threaten that she would destroy the whole family of the respondent and that there would be no heir/successor left in the family. On 5.4.2012 at about 12.00 noon she left her parental home along with three children namely, Neha, Anu and Khemraj on the pretext that she was going to her parental house which was located in the same village. Since she did not return till evening as promised, he started searching for her. During the course of the search, the garments and slippers of the children

and the appellant were found lying near the well of Ramialji. The police were informed and on search dead bodies of the three children were recovered from the well and the appellant was also taken out of the well half alive. A criminal case was instituted and she was convicted for an offence under Section 302 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (in short the 'IPC'). She was pregnant at that time and subsequently delivered a child. She filed an application for bail. While on bail, she filed a false case alleging dowry demand against the respondent-husband and his family members. Final report was given by police and it was observed that a false case had been lodged. Ram Awtar, a long time house help, could vouchsafe for most of the allegations of cruelty, demands for money and threats of harm to the children and to the respondent. Unfortunately, the appellant got angry with him on some trivial matter of not accounting for the shopping of vegetables that he did for the house a little before the filing of the divorce petition. In fact, she even said that she suspected that he was regularly stealing money on this count."

The appellant filed her response to the petition for divorce, denied all allegations of cruelty and contended that no amount was borrowed by her father or any of her family members. On the other hand, the respondent-husband used to threaten her for dowry and she had never perpetuated any cruelty so far as the children and the husband are concerned. She did not know as to how the children fell into the well. She was herself unconscious and recovered after about four days. The husband, in fact, turned her out of matrimonial home on 5.4.2012 along with their three children. Unfortunately, she and the three children fell into the well. The appeal is pending against her conviction, on ground of misinterpretation of facts and circumstances that resulted in gross miscarriage of justice.

The Family Court found that the Respondent's allegations of cruelty were established. Several instances were noted. One of them related to her behaviour on the date of judgment in the criminal case. After the judgment of conviction was pronounced, she threatened to kill the husband and prosecute him. It was also noted by the Court that the allegations made by her alleging for dowry demand was dis-believed and the police gave final report stating that the case was falsely lodged. The respondent's sole witness, Ram Awtar fully corroborated all the allegations in the petition, the Court said.

The Court also took into account the fact of conviction of the appellant in a criminal case, and finally granted the decree of divorce. On appeal, the decree was confirmed by the High Court holding that the High Court shall not reopen the findings of facts by the lower court. The

High Court also rejected an application for a certificate for Second Appeal to the Supreme Court of India.

The Supreme Court is now hearing the case on a Special Leave petition on 30.10.2023.

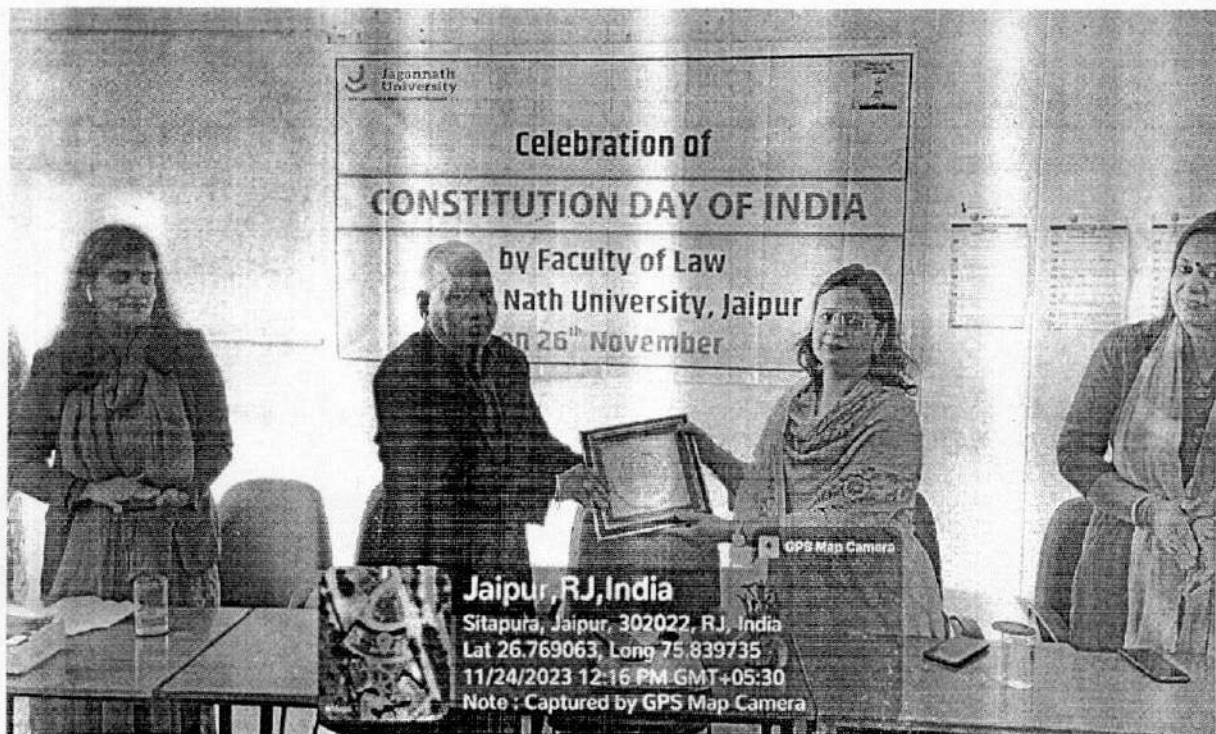
The Event

The term "moot" traces its origins to Anglo-Saxon times, when a moot was a gathering of prominent men in a locality to discuss matters of local importance. The modern activity differs from a mock trial, as moot court usually refers to a simulated appellate court or arbitral case, while a mock trial usually refers to a simulated jury trial or bench trial.

Moot court does not involve actual testimony by witnesses, cross-examination, or the presentation of evidence, but is focused solely on the application of the law to a common set of evidentiary assumptions to which the competitors must be introduced. In most countries, the phrase "a moot court" may be shortened to simply "a moot" and the activity may be called "mooting". Participants are either referred to as "mooters" or "mooties".

Faculty of Law organized an inter semester moot court competition of all semesters on 18 January 2024 at moot court room between 11:00 am to 1:00 p.m. Five teams participated from all semesters. One round was held for which draw of lots was held. The round was judged by law faculties Dr. Varsha Dhabhai and Mr. Abhishek Bishnoi. The winner of the

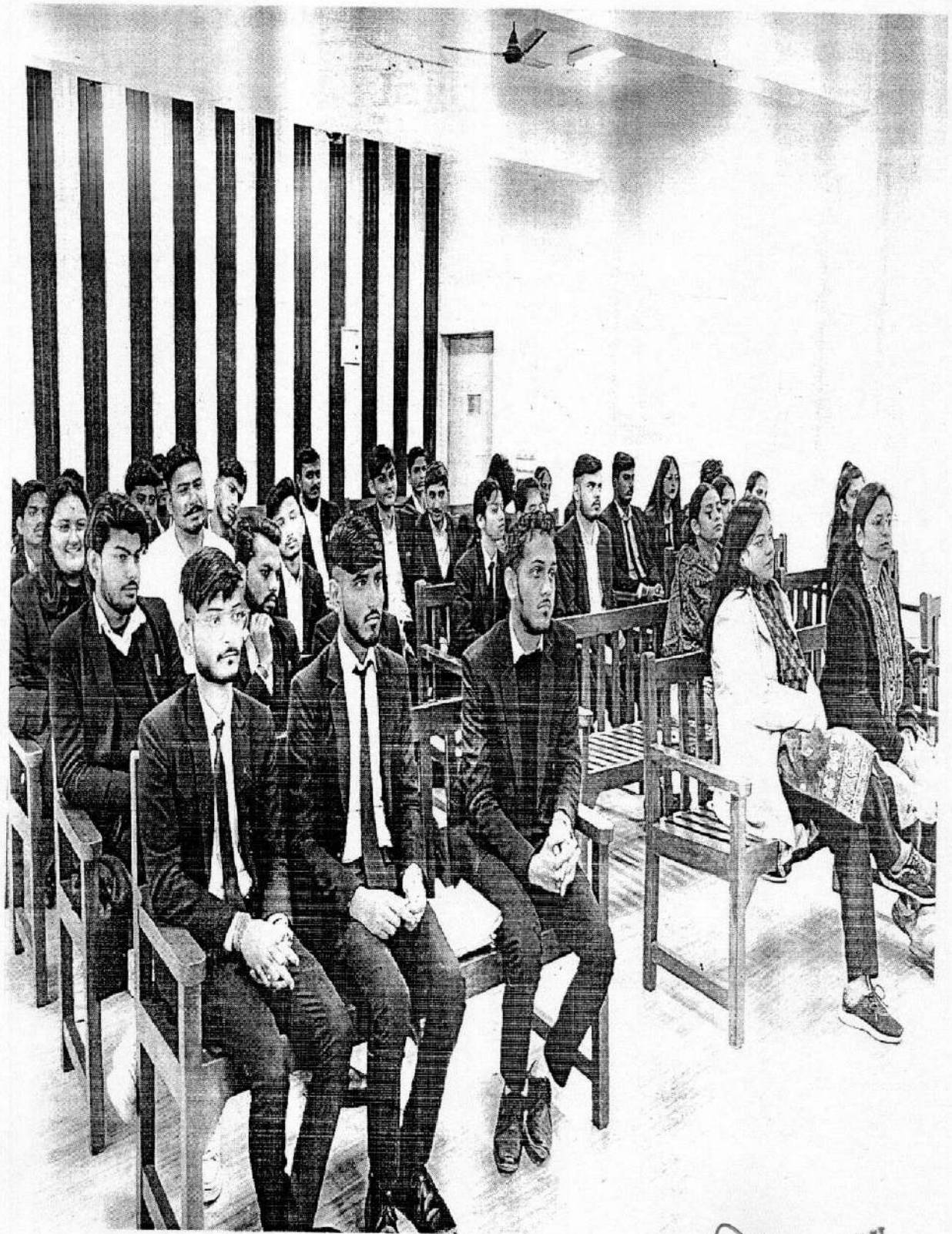

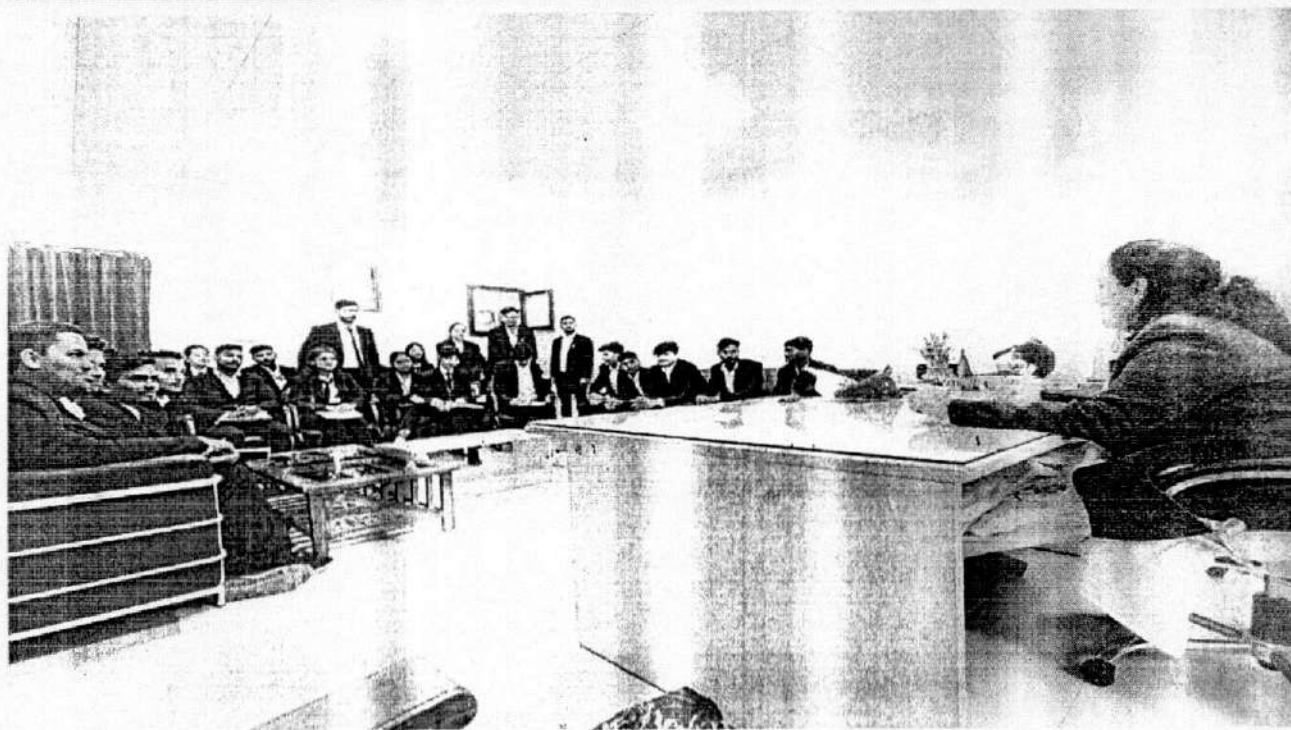

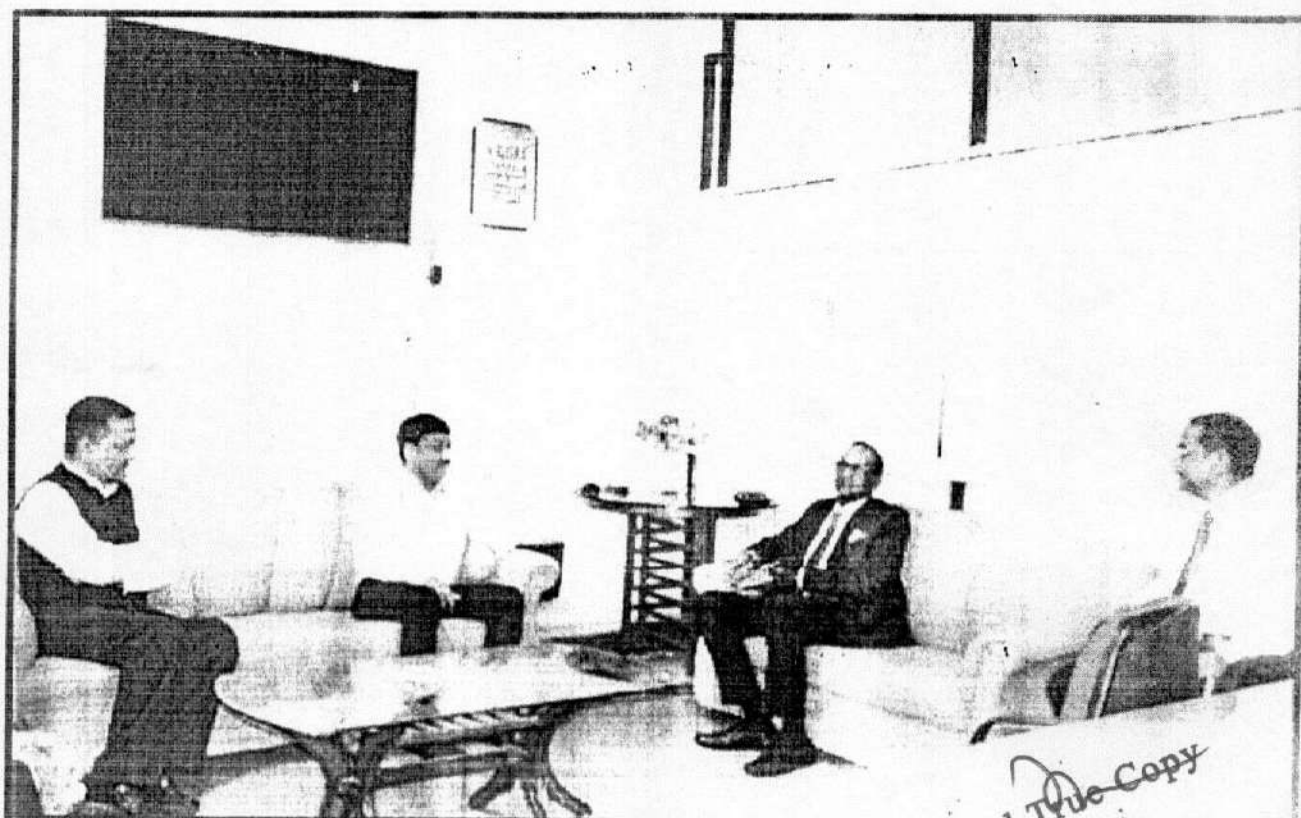

After the inaugural ceremony the teams were asked to report to their respective moot court as per draw of lots.

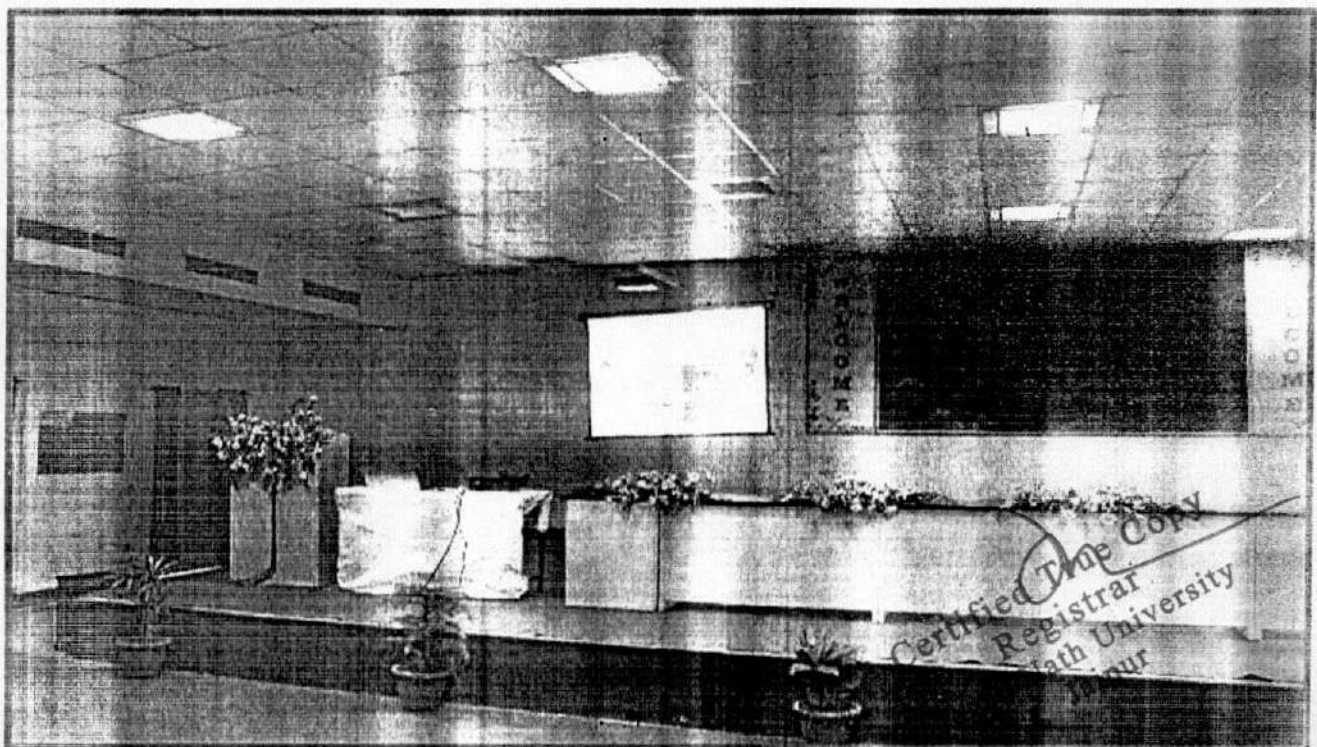
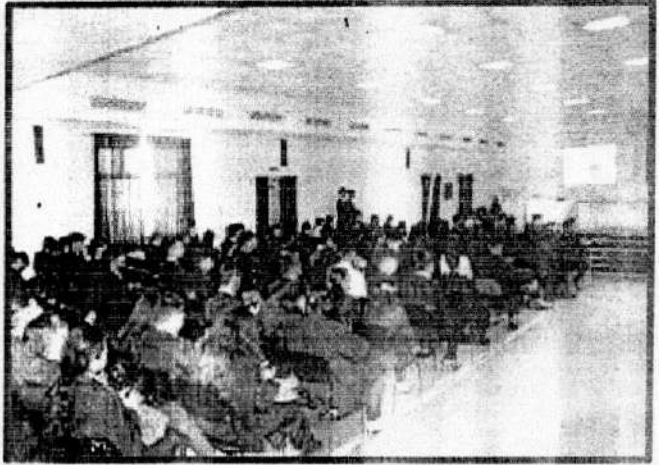

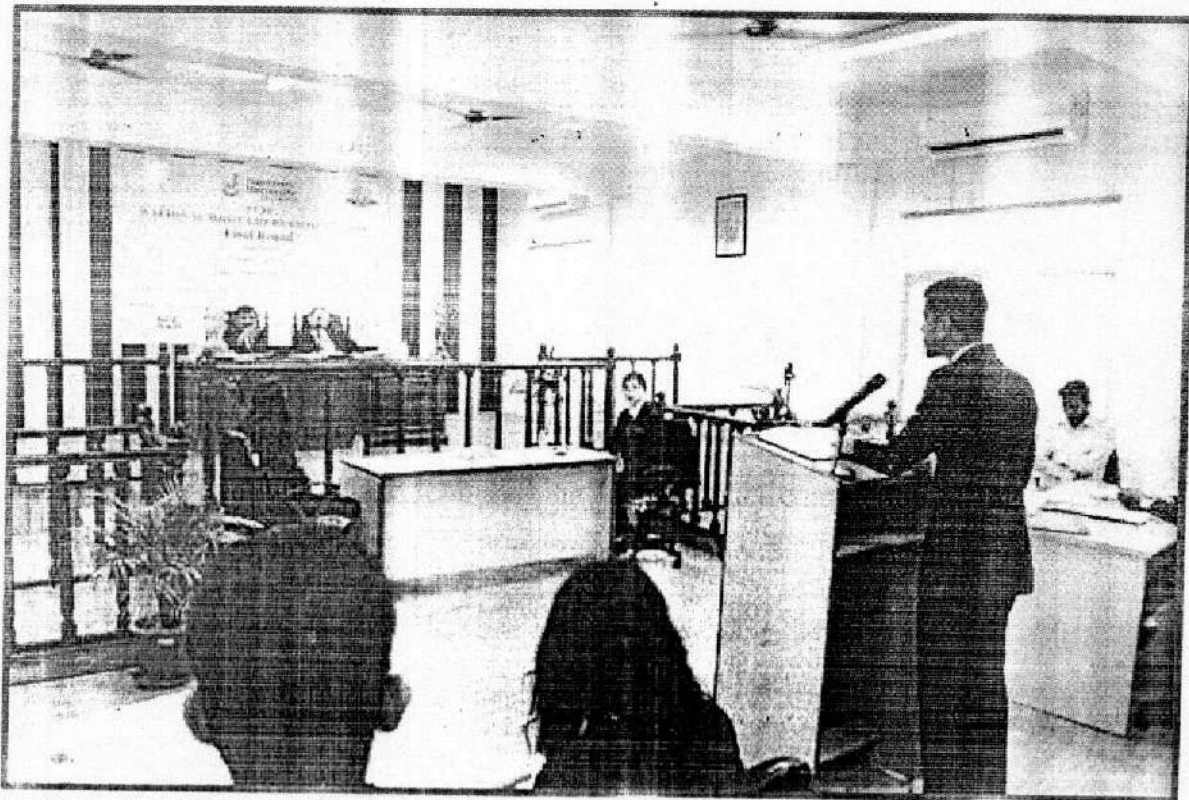
The day was concluded with a gala night for all the participants.

Report on New Criminal Laws in India: Salient Features

Dr. Bhupesh Rathor, Assistant Professor (Senior Scale)
Delhi University Centre II

On 25th May, 2024.

The guest lecture on "New Criminal Laws in India: Salient Features" was Conducted by Faculty of Law Jagannath University Jaipur. Dr. Bhupesh Rathor Assistant Professor (Senior Scale) Centre II, Delhi University shared her valuable insights and provided a comprehensive overview of recent legislative developments in the Indian legal system. The speaker elucidated amendments to the Indian Penal Code (IPC), focusing on provisions related to cybercrime, white-collar crime, and crimes against women and children. Emphasis was placed on the inclusion of stringent penalties for offenses such as cyber fraud and online harassment.

In a comprehensive discussion held on May 25, 2024, Dr. Bhupesh Rathor, serving as the guest speaker, provided an in-depth analysis of the recent amendments and introductions to criminal laws in India. Here's a detailed overview of the salient features discussed during the session. Dr. Bhupesh Rathor commenced the discussion by elucidating the significant revisions brought forth by the Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 2019. He emphasized the Act's pivotal role in fortifying the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC). Noteworthy features highlighted include:

The Act introduced stringent penalties, including the death penalty, for egregious offenses such as rape, gang rape, and sexual assault, especially against minors. She underscored the gravity of these provisions in deterring heinous crimes and ensuring justice for victims. Another crucial aspect discussed was the Act's mandate for expeditious trials in cases of sexual offenses. Dr. Bhupesh Rathor elucidated the importance of swift justice delivery in minimizing trauma for victims and instilling public trust in the legal system. She elaborated on the Act's provisions for stringent bail conditions, aimed at preventing the evasion of justice by perpetrators and safeguarding the integrity of the trial process.

Transitioning to the Protection of Children from Sexual Offenses (POCSO) Amendment Act, 2020, Dr. Bhupesh Rathor highlighted its pivotal role in fortifying protections for children against sexual abuse. Key features discussed include: The Act expanded the definitions of sexual offenses against children to

The discussion culminated with an examination of the Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 2022, which aimed to bolster the criminal justice system against contemporary challenges. Dr. Bhupesh Rathor elaborated on key provisions, including:

Highlighting the proliferation of cybercrimes, Dr. Bhupesh Rathor discussed the Act's provisions targeting offenses such as data breaches, online fraud, and cyberbullying. He emphasized the imperative of aligning legal frameworks with technological advancements to combat emerging threats effectively. She elucidated the Act's focus on victim protection measures, including provisions for witness protection, compensation, and rehabilitation. He emphasized the significance of empowering and safeguarding the rights of victims throughout the legal process.

Dr. Bhupesh Rathor concluded by elucidating the Act's provisions for restorative justice, promoting alternative dispute resolution methods and victim-offender mediation. He underscored the transformative potential of restorative justice in fostering reconciliation and healing within communities.

In conclusion, Dr. Bhupesh Rathor reiterated the proactive nature of these legislative reforms in addressing societal challenges and ensuring justice for victims. He emphasized the imperative of effective implementation, coupled with public awareness and sensitization efforts, in realizing the transformative potential of these legal reforms. The session provided attendees with valuable insights into the evolving landscape of criminal laws in India, fostering a deeper understanding of the legislative measures aimed at upholding justice and safeguarding the rights of all individuals within Indian society.

This detailed report encapsulates Dr. Bhupesh Rathor extensive analysis of the recent amendments to criminal laws in India, presented during the session on May 25, 2024.

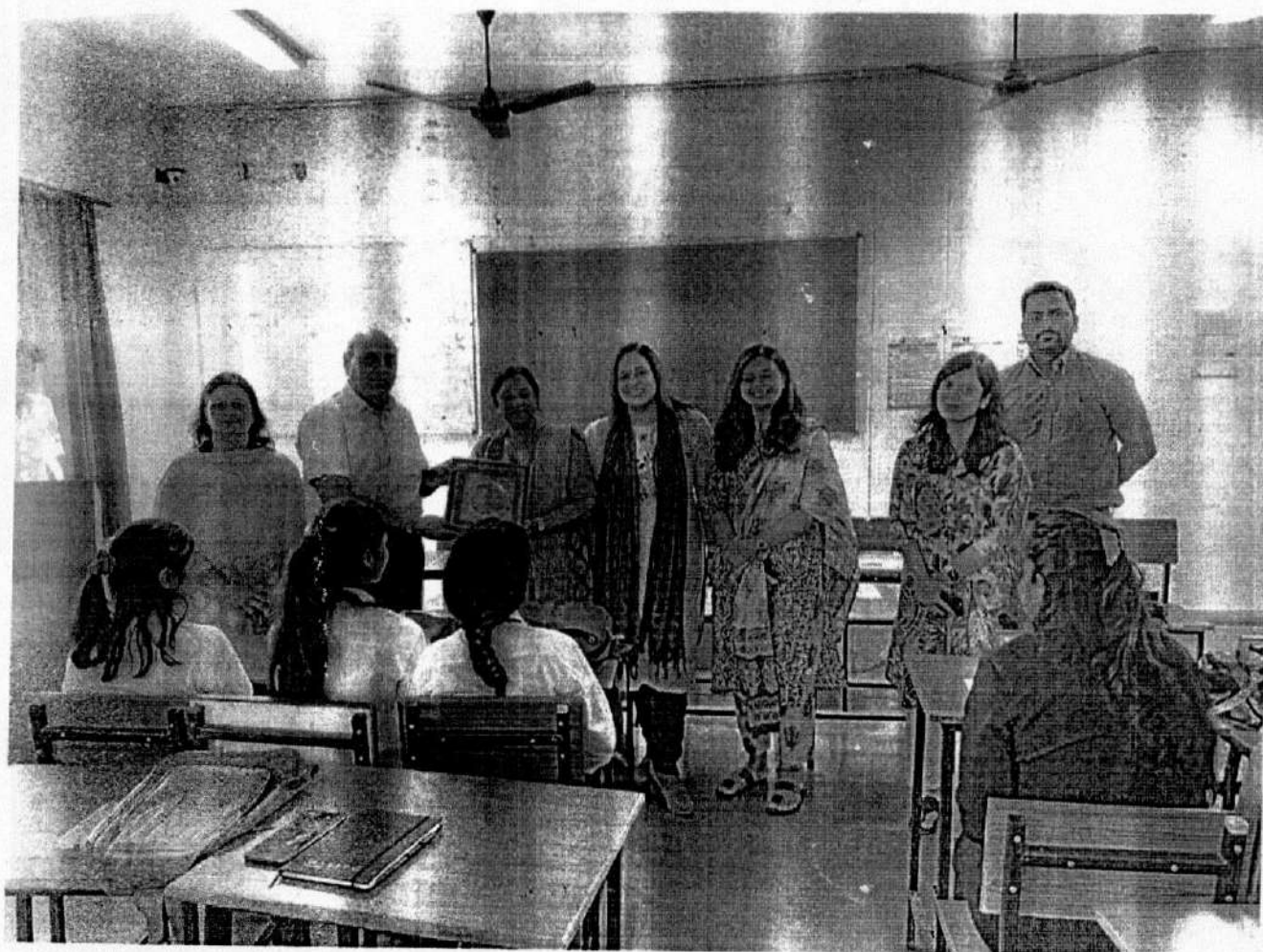

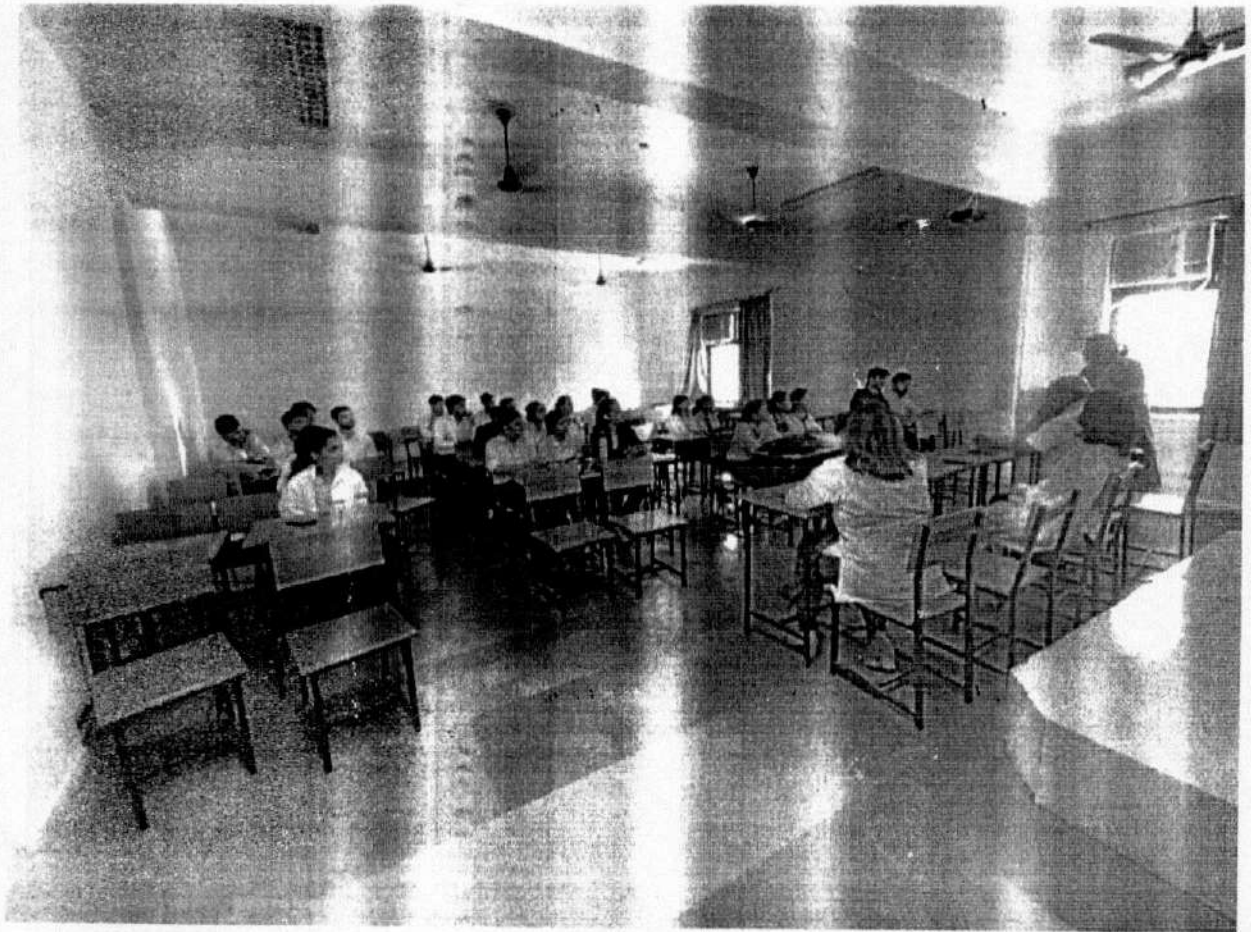

Mr. Ghanshyam, residing in Jaipur, saw the above advertisement and believed the accuracy of the statements appearing in the advertisement. His son Rishabh, aged 17 years, was down with fever and was taken to their family doctor Satyanarayan on April 1, 2024. He then made Rishabh take the three weeks course of the pill. Dr. Satyanarayan had no knowledge of the said advertisement.

However, despite having taken the said course of medicines Rishabh contracted H1N1 flu on April 25, 2024. Mr. Ghanshyam, on behalf of his son wrote to the Company about his son contracting the H1N1 flu and asking for INR 15000 as promised by them in their advertisement.

The Company denied the amount saying there was never a contract between Mr. Rishabh and the Company due to the following:

- Mr. Rishabh is a minor and does not have capacity to enter into a valid contract.
- Dr. Satyanarayan while prescribing the pill to Mr. Rishabh was not aware of the terms and conditions prescribed in the advertisement.
- Mr. Rishabh did not communicate his acceptance to the Company and
- The contract was concluded in Jaipur where as it should have been concluded where the offer was made, i.e. New Delhi.

Legal Issues;

1. Whether there was a valid contract between Rishabh and company?
2. Whether company is liable to pay compensation of INR 15000?
