Report on Swachhta hi Sewa Campaign (Under Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan) 11 September to 2 October 2019

Jagan Nath University is one of the participating institutes under Unnat harat Abhiyan. As per the guidelines of Minister of Higher Education (MHRD), Government of India under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) we have to participated in the "Swachhta Hi Sewa" Campaign in the 5 adopted villages nad make them plastic free villages.

As one of the participating UBA institutions we have distributed **Cloth Bags** in each household of our adopted villages (Birdhpura Swami ka Bas, Mahachandpura, Rampura, Girdharilalpura, Tigariya) and collected back all **Plastic Bags** that are being used by them. The campaign was run between 11 Sept to 2nd October, 2019 and now these villages may be declared as plastic free village. The details of the campaign is as follows:

11-14 Sept - Village MAHACHANPURA - 40 student volunteers with 5 faculty members visited the village and collected plastic waste from each household and distributed cloth bags to each household. approximately 12 kgs of plastic waste is collected from the village and 100 cloth bags were distributed in the village.

16-21 Sept.- Village RAMPURA- 40 student volunteers with 5 faculty members visited the village and collected plastic waste from each household and distributed cloth bags to each household. Approximately 10 kgs of plastic waste is collected from the village and 100 cloth bags were distributed in the village.

23-28 Sept- Village - GIRDHARILALPURA & TIGARIYA - 40 student volunteers with 5 faculty members visited the village and collected plastic waste from each household and distributed cloth bags to each household. Approximately 18 kgs of plastic waste is collected from the village and 200 cloth bags were distributed in the village

30 Sept-2 Oct. .- Village- BIRDHPURA SWAMI KA BAS - 20 student volunteers with 3 faculty members visited the village and collected plastic waste from each household and distributed cloth bags to each household. Approximately 12 kgs of plastic waste is collected from the village and 100 cloth bags were distributed in the village.

JaganNath University have conducted rally in each of the adopted villages for the awareness of harmful effects of plastic waste. Also conducted a meeting with the Sarpanch and ward members of each village for the ban of single use plastic.

Jagannath University have collected around 52 kgs of plastic waste from all the households of our adopted villages. We have distributed 500 cloth bags in our adopted villages.






PLANTATION PROGRAM 4 September 2015








Activity Report

SWACHH BHARAT SUMMER INTERNSHIP 2018

""Cleanliness Is Next to Godliness." - Mahatma Gandhi.


Swachh Bharat Summer Internship 2018, the hundred hour program of Swachhata, has been organized by the Ministry of Water and Sanitation in association with the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India. The objective of this internship programme was to engage the youth across the country and develop their skill and orientation for sanitation related work, amplifying mass awareness on cleanliness and cement the people's movement (Jan *Andolan*) aspect of Swachh Bharat Mission. This is in line with the Prime Minister Narendra Modi's call on October 2, 2014 for each individual to devote 100 hours to Swachhata through the year. The programme was expected to not only provide a great learning experience to students but hopes to also further the existing measures undertaken by the government in ensuring a clean and healthy India.

As a part of the internship, the awareness that interns constructed were divided into two segments: first, (IEC) Information, Education and Communication activities and second, (SWM) Solid Waste Management related activities that targeted generation of awareness around waste collection, segregation, disposal and waste free environment. IEC activities are oriented towards increasing awareness among people about sanitation related issues and trigger a change in sanitation related behaviour.

The main endeavor of the program was to integrate students in the community service in rural areas. The university prepared an action plan on "Swachh Bharat Summer Internship 2018" and organized various activities during summer vacation and has planned to organize many more in the forthcoming session 2018-19. A total of 50 individual volunteers and 57 in teams as volunteers, who got registered under the summer internship, was formed in the month of May 2018 to support and compliment 'Swachh Bharat Mission' of the Government of India. Through the said program, JaganNath University initiated a campaign to make the public, especially in rural areas, aware about the mission of Swachhata. During this 100 hour program, the interns were given the opportunity to perform cleanliness related activities.

Under the Information, Education and Communicative activities, JaganNath University interns have done following activities during SBSI program:

- 1. Organized awareness campaigns for better sanitation practices like using a toilet, hand washing, health and hygiene awareness etc.
- 2. Organized Swachhata awareness rally in the villages.
- 3. Conducted door-to door meetings to stimulate change with respect to sanitation practices.
- 4. Conducted school and village level rallies to generate awareness about sanitation



The second category, Solid Waste Management related activities targeted generation of awareness around waste collection, segregation, disposal and waste free environment:

- 1. Organized waste collection drives in households and shared spaces.
- 2. Organized lectures on solid waste management.
- 3. Engaged community and gram panchayats to build compost pits, (where organic matter decomposed to form organic manure
- 4. Piloted awareness drives of cleaning of streets, drains and back alleys.

Apart from this, following activities have been conducted by our volunteers under SBSI 2018:

- · Conducted awareness drives and programs on personal Hygiene and Sanitation
- · Special lecture and demonstrations on Solid Waste Management
- World Environment Day was celebrated by conducting Swachhata awareness programs and rallies on "Say No to Plastic'.
- Awareness Campaigns/Programs/lectures on Underground Drainage System.
- · Special lectures were conducted on Vermicompost Pits.

Summary of Swachh Bharat Summer Internship-2018

1. AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS AND INTERACTIVE SESSIONS

The IEC activities undertaken by the SBSI interns to target behavioural changes around open defecation, hygiene practices, solid/liquid waste management among others behaviour and public awareness campaigns were strategically planned to reach the target audience and to communicate specific messages tailored to that group. Interactive sessions are more successful if they are tailored to the context, values language and resources available to local audience. The awareness campaigns were conducted keeping in mind the objective of the internship i.e. Swachhata. Various campaigns were conducted oriented towards personal hygiene, health, cleanliness, segregation of waste and its disposal, and prevention of vector borne diseases like malaria, dengue and digging of compost pits were conducted. The awareness programs were categorized in three fragments: (i) Door to Door visits (ii) Awareness rallies (iii) Special lectures and interactive public talks.

Initially, the focus was on observing and analysing the condition of the selected villages through field work.

During the awareness drives, our volunteers made hand-made posters, pamphlets and placards exhibiting the basic ideas, slogans and taglines of Swachhata like "Hum Sabka Ek Hi Nara, Saaf Suthra Ho Desh Humara, "Geela Kachra Hare Dustbin Mai", Sukha Kachra Neele Dustbin Mai" "Green India, Clean India". The efforts were made to meet the above stated objectives and focused specifically on prohibition of the use of plastic bags as well.





2. DOOR-TO-DOOR CAMPAIGN

The main goal was to create awareness among rural people and particularly engaging the local community in cleanliness drives. Door to Door meeting was done for spreading awareness about personal hygiene and sanitation. Our interns spread the awareness on epidemic diseases that are caused by the dirty and unhygienic surroundings.

3. AWARENESS RALLIES

The awareness rallies aimed at spreading among the public the notion of swachhata and its importance. The participants used the slogans of Swachh Bharat while carrying placards with information about the harmful effects of using plastic.



4. SPECIAL LECTURES ON SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT AND PERSONAL HYGIENE

Special lectures were organized on Solid Waste Management and development of compost pits, using waste. Under the "Swachhata" Mission, Government of India, a workshops were organized on Compost making were organized by the SBSI interns.

6. CONSTRUCTION OF COMPOST PITS

Composting is a organic way of recycling and is one of the simplest ways to manage solid waste. It can be done at home. It involves decomposing daily kitchen waste into a rich soil known as compost. Fundamentally, when you compost kitchen waste it will return the nutrients back into the soil, as a result, the life cycle continues. Villagers were given demonstration on making of compost pits. The advantages of compost pits were demostrated to the local people.



7. STREET CLEANING, DRAIN CLEANING, CLEANING OF BACK ALLEYS

To emphasise the idea of community engaged tasks, the cleanliness drives aimed to inculcate in the community the importance of cleanliness of shared and public space. Cleanliness drives were conducted with the active participation of the residents. The interns cleaned the streets and also convinced people to participate in this community based program. SBSI Volunteers actively participated in these sensitization drives and created awareness among villagers about prevention of vector borne diseases like Malaria, Dengue.

8. CLEANLINESS AND WASTE COLLECTION DRIVES

The dry waste from houses like plastic bottles and paper were collected.

Faculty and staff member of Jagannath University actively participated in this festival by giving and by motivating students also to share the joy of giving.



In view of recent decisions of the Government, India is on the cusp of a major financial revolution. As we shift from a cash-dependent to a cashless economy, we look forward to better social equity, availability of more resources for development work through higher revenue collection, eradication of counterfeit currency, a reduction in illegal transactions and a curb on black money.

The purpose of the 'Vittiya Saksharta Abhiyan' is to actively engage the youth/ students of Higher Education Institutions to encourage and motivate all payers and payees to use a digitally enabled cashless economic system for transfer of funds. Ministry of Human Resource Development views the institutions of higher education in the country, faculty members and students to take the lead and act as engines of this transformational shift.

The best way of leadership is to lead by example. All heads of higher educational institutions should plan for a cashless campus, within a limited timeframe, for all transactions within the campus. Various options of digital transactions are presented here. To begin with, the faculty, staff and students, whom we refer to as engines of change, need to dispel the commonly held belief that digital transactions are complex and necessarily require a smart phone and internet connectivity. They need to further educate their family members and people in their immediate surroundings and motivate them for digital transactions. NCC/NSS volunteers of an institute may take up a major market and interact with shop owners, including vendors, and their associations with an objective of developing a cashless market focusing on each point of sale.

This provides facilities for registration of each volunteer which will enable them to upload their achievements periodically. Major achievement will be acknowledged and commended.

The Ministry of Human Resource Development looks forward to active participation of students, faculty and staff members of all educational institutions in accomplishing this challenging task.

We at Jagannath University want our students/ faculties / vendors to actively participate in this campaign of cashless economy. In this connection only we have conducted three training session in our campus by for our students/ faculties/vendors to become familiar with cashless transactions and further they can also train the people to move towards cashless transactions.

The training session was on Digital campaign. In the session students were made inclined towards the need of digital transactions, digital economy and digital world. Cashless transaction economy doesn't mean shortage of cash rather it indicates a culture of people settling transactions digitally. In a modern economy, money moves electronically. Hence the spread of digital payment culture along with the expansion of infrastructure facilities is needed to achieve the goal.

On November 8th, government withdrawned Rs 500 and Rs 1000 notes- two highest denominations in circulation. Main objectives were to fight counterfeit money and black money. The action has given tremendous boost to cashless transactions as card based and digital payments were not hindered when all high denomination cash transactions suffered because of absence of high denomination currencies.

There are several reasons why the government and the RBI brings up measures to promote cashless transaction economy. besides convenience, digital transaction gives more scope for recording of transactions and in this way it is a first step against the spread of unaccounted money or black money. Secondly, the problem of counterfeit notes can also be avoided when payment is settled digitally. The RBI and government have launched several measures for the spread of electronic and other non-cash settlement culture. The Vision-2018 for Payment and Settlement Systems in India brought by the RBI in June 2016 reiterates the commitment to encourage greater use of electronic payments by all sections of society so as to achieve a "less-cash" society.

"The broad contours of Vision-2018 revolve around five Cs — coverage, convenience, confidence, convergence, and cost. To achieve these, Vision-2018 will focus on four strategic initiatives such as responsive regulation, robust infrastructure, effective supervision and customer-centricity," — RBI. The vision statement highlights following plans:

- The regulator wants to reduce the share of paper-based clearing instruments
- It aims to raise growth of the digital payments space
- It wants to ensure accelerated use of Aadhaar in payment systems

Government also made fiscal measures for the encouragement of card culture in the 2016 budget. Exempting service charge on card-based and other digital payments was one such step. Aadhar based payment system will be a big boost for promoting the cashless transaction culture.

The technology has spread internet banking, mobile banking, prepaid instruments, credit and debit cards etc. and at the same time, electronic payments system is fast growing. All these indicate that India is moving towards the RBI's goal of less cash economy-steady but slowly.

Students were told how they can be engine in making India Digital. They were told about the benefits of going digital and were explained about the different modes of adopting digital transactions. They were told that as part of promoting cashless transactions and converting India into less-cash society, various modes of digital payments are available. These modes are:



SECOND TRAINING SESSION 21.01.2017 CONDUCTED BY: Mr. SANDEEP BHARDWAJ MANAGER-IT SBBJ BANK



A training session in our campus was conducted by SBBJ Bank for our students/faculties/vendors to become familiar with cashless transactions and further they can also train the people to move towards cashless transactions. Lots of queries on cashless transactions by students/ faculties/ vendors were resolved in the session.

The training session was conducted by:

Mr. Sandeep Bhardwaj explained the role of banks in digital transactions and how banks are taking initiatives and steps in going digital. He also explained that to be sure, the government on its part is working at various levels to reduce the dependence on cash. Opening bank accounts for the unbanked under the and adoption of direct benefit transfer is part of the overall idea to reduce usage of cash and increase transparency. RBI has also issued licenses to open new-age small finance banks and payments banks which are expected to give a push to financial inclusion and bring innovative banking solutions. Things are also falling in place in terms of technology for India. The recently launched Unified Payments Interface by National Payments Corporation of India makes digital transactions as simple as sending a text message. He said that as one of the biggest beneficiaries of this transition, banks and related service providers will have to constantly invest in technology in order to improve security and ease of transaction. People will only shift when it's easier, certain and safe to make cashless transactions. He told the students that the government, too, is taking steps to promote digital payments as it seeks to curb black money. It is pushing BHIM (Bharat Interface for Money), a mobile payment app based that on UPI (Unified Payment Interface) for banks and USSD (Unstructured Supplementary Service Data) modes of e-payment. It can be activated with fingerprints and the government is looking to integrate Aadhaar with the BHIM app, making the 12-digit identification number a universal payment ID. The National Payments Corporation of India, the nodal agency for all retail payment systems in the country, is working with Visa and MasterCard to develop a common OR code to facilitate cashless transactions in shops. Internet banking solutions such as NEFT (national electronic funds transfer) and RTGS (real time gross settlement) for corporate customers are in place. There are offline payment



methods, eliminating internet security and malware threats. With UPI, money can be transferred from one bank account to another without an intermediary and the money stays in the consumer's account until the transaction is complete. Paying through digital wallets needs a third party linking the payer and the payee.
