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I. THE UNIVERSITY

Jagan Nath University, Jaipur has been established by an Act of the Rajasthan State Legislature (Act No. 19 of 2008) on April 16, 2008. The vision for the University is to develop it as a Centre of Excellence for higher education and research committed towards quality education, skill development, industry integration and holistic eco-system for global competencies among youth and sustainable development of the Nation.

Jagan Nath University, Jaipur has been accredited by NAAC (2nd Cycle) with "A" grade in 2022 and is member of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU). The University has also acquired a distinctive status in agriculture education of having been accredited by ICAR for its B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture program and is also member of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU). All the programs offered by the University are approved by the State Government and relevant regulatory Councils, wherever applicable. The main campus of the University is situated at NH-12, Chaksu Bypass, Tonk Road, at the outskirts of Jaipur city with a fully developed lush green, pollution free and serene environment. The second campus of the University, as approved in the Act, is located at Sitapura, Industrial Area, Jaipur. Both these campuses are well connected by air, rail and road transport.

The University has been promoted by Jagan Nath Gupta Memorial Education Society, a non-profit organization, having a track record of 31 years of excellence in higher education having established institutions in the State of Rajasthan, Delhi, UP and Haryana. JIMS group of institutions are known for quality education maintaining high standards of professional governance.

The University has developed a robust infrastructure consisting of teaching blocks, administrative block, central library, well equipped labs, hostels, IT infrastructure, skill development centre, incubation centre, staff quarters, auditorium, canteen, play grounds, gymnasium, farm research centre, poly house, medical facility and others.

The University is offering UG and PG programs in the areas of Engineering & Technology, Architecture, Management, Law, Agriculture, Physical Sciences, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy and Education. The Ph.D. programs are offered in select disciplines. Apart from these University is offering certain programs through ODL / OL mode. The outcome based curriculum for the programs are updated and new innovative programs introduced as per the market trends. Well qualified faculty in adequate number is available to implement the academic programs and faculty retention ratio is quite high. During its short span of existence, the University has emerged as a premier institution to inspire, motivate and nurture professional excellence among students and faculty.

The University has taken a number of initiatives to promote quality education in the present globally competitive environment. The CBCS system has been fully operational since 2015, and

effective teaching-learning process, industry exposure, skill education integration in curriculum design, holistic education approach, research and project based learning, outcome based assessments, etc. are the main features of academic system of this University. The research journal of the University has received approval from the National Science Library in July, 2020. Further, the salient features of the New Education Policy, 2020 are being implemented from the session 2022-23 in phased manner, taking the academic system a way ahead in tune with the latest higher education policy framework in the country and requirements of market economy.

During its short existence, the University has had many accomplishments to its credit towards achieving its goals for quality education, research and community engagement. The University was approved by the UGC under 2(f) in period of just one year of its establishment, got accreditation from NAAC in 2015, approval from various SRAs (BCI, NCTE, PCI, ITPI and UGC-DEB) for programs in respective disciplines, and approval of the NSDC for skill development programs. The UGC approval under section 12(B) is in process.

The University has taken a number of steps to promote social outreach activities through adoption of villages under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) scheme and organized various extension activities under this project. The University has established Social Entrepreneurship, Swacchta and Rural Engagement Cell (SEC-REC) approved by Mahatama Gandhi National Council of Rural Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India. The students of various departments organize programs like Legal Aid and Literacy Camp, NSS activities, SUPW camp, digital literacy camp, etc. in adopted villages.

The University has created framework and action plan for improving facilities at campus in the areas of sanitation and hygiene, waste management, vermi-compost plant, water management, energy conservation, plantation for green and sustainable environment and conservation of natural resources. A Solar Plant of 200 KW capacity has been installed, Sewerage Treatment and Rain Water Harvesting plants are in place.

The University has signed MoUs with various industrial and professional organizations to promote industry interface, skill education and quality internships and placements. Further, to promote student centric environment, the required policy framework is in place and works through Training and Placement Cell, Center for Guidance and Career Counseling, Anti-Ragging Cell, Women Development Cell, Student Welfare Cell, Student Grievances Redressal process, SC/ST and OBC Cell and Minority Cell and many more. Policy for scholarships and free-ships for students on merit-cum-means basis exist. Alumni Association is already registered and alumni meetings are organized regularly. The students do participate in various curricular and extra-curricular activities including sports, cultural and celebration of national level festivals.

The academic system of the University is comprehensive, dynamic and vibrant incorporating the latest policy framework NEP-2020 of the UGC and Ministry of Education, supported by state-of-the-art infrastructure and extensive use of ICT resources for achieving objectives of quality education, employability, creativity, innovations and human values among learners to produce good citizenship and skilled manpower. The University aspires to be a center of excellence for higher education in modern context in the years to come.

The University has been awarded as "Best Academic Institute" in Rajasthan Leadership Award 2023, The University has also received "Excellence in Higher Education" award from Shri B.D. Kalla, Hon'ble Education Minister of Rajasthan in Education Summit 2023.

Infrastructure

The University has its main campus situated at Chaksu Bypass, Jaipur which is in proximity to the Airport and Industrial area on Tonk Road, with all modern education facilities. The University has a satellite campus comprising of 10 acres at Sitapura. The Wi-Fi enabled campus has the state-of-art infrastructure comprising magnificent buildings, environmentally conditioned Administrative Block, Academic Blocks, spacious Class Rooms with internet and intranet connectivity and hi-tech multimedia and audio-visual equipments, well-equipped

modern Laboratories, Learning Resource Centre, Auditoriums, Seminar Halls, separate hostels for boys and girls with special emphasis on healthy and nutritious diet, Health Centre, Students Centre, ramps for physically challenged students, sports and fitness facilities including Gymnasium and various sports gournds, on campus residential facilities for a large number of faculty and staff. Both the campuses have a unique calmness with serene atmosphere and green foliage. The University has a phased expansion of 17.39 hec. of land available in the campus. The Management has also increased the area under green foliage from 58.3 percent to 62.7 percent. The area under polyhouse plantation has been increased by 500 sq.mts. The campus has been secured by installation of 60 CCTV cameras and live footage monitoring by IT Cell. Regular sanitisation exercises are also being included in maintenance of the campus infrastructure.

Library

The University Library, like all vibrant and productive organizations, strives to keep pace with a global, dynamic and technology-enabled information environment to meet the expectations of its users. The University library during the year continued to march to its mission of facilitating the creation of knowledge through the acquisition, organization and dissemination of library materials. It offered a range of services including reference and consultation, membership and circulation, document delivery, resource sharing, information alert service, user awareness programs, etc.

The library is fully computerized and is located at the main campus in Chaksu with a network extending to Sitapura campus of the University. The central library is housed in an independent spacious building enough to cater not only the existing needs but also accommodates resources and services for future requirements. Our efforts in building and updating the collection continue unabated. Our collection development policy is not constrained by any boundaries and is responsive to the evolving subject areas and demand from curricula.

The Library is well stocked with textbooks, reference books, national and international periodicals and journals besides many official reports, with reprints. For the benefit of students, a Book Bank with a special collection of prescribed text books is being provided by the library. The library also provides latest research and reference material in print and audio-visual formats along with the facility to refer to e-journals, CDs, Project Reports, Government Publications, Reports and Newsletters, back volumes related to Management, Engineering, Design, Science, Law, Architecture etc. and the allied subjects for the reference of the students and the faculty which help them in strengthening the teaching and learning process.

As a matter of policy, the University pays special attention to not only strengthening the library with additional books and journals, but also to ensure that they are well utilized by the students for their courses as well as to enhance their level of general awareness. Over the years, the library has attained the distinction of being one of the richest University Libraries of the State. The library is enriched with 1334 e-books and databases J-Gate and I-Scholar in order to facilitate students and faculty to enrich their knowledge and facilitate in research area.

Class Rooms

The spacious and airy classrooms have been designed to propel an enquiry based learning that fosters liberation of mind and eagerness to learn. The Classrooms with internet connectivity are well equipped with Hi-tech multimedia and audio-visual equipments to facilitate effective learning which sets the tone in stimulating discussions. The classrooms are the platforms where the students imbibe the virtues of hard work, discipline, ethical practices and achieve the high standards of excellence in every sphere of life. A total of 73 classrooms are there in the existing infrastructure and many have been upgraded with smart boards.

Specially trained technicians who are well versed in handling specialized instruments manage the laboratories. All labs undergo routine inspection and maintenance services. Regular sanitization exercise is being carried out in the labs.

The University has a Computer Center well-equipped with the advanced computer systems, line printers, laser printers, scanners etc., to facilitate, foster, and support the essential teaching and research goals of University through the deployment and delivery of computing and communication services to the University faculty, staff and students. The University has upto 1 GBPS high speed internet bandwidth through NKN. The access to internet and optimal use of Information Technology by all the faculty members and students are ensured by providing around 1000 nodes/internet connection points in various Departments including University Library. Every department has smart classroom to fecilitate advance learning. There is smart LED panel to fecilitate online conference, workshops, vedio conferencing etc.

Each Faculty member has been provided a workstation with internet connectivity. All the departments are equipped with computer systems, printers, scanners and LCD Projectors to support the academic and administrative activities. Adequate numbers of general as well as domain specific software are available for quality teaching and research.

Hostels

A hostel is a home away from home. Aware of the needs and requirements of students, who come from far-flung places, the university tries to provide them a safe, secure and affordable accommodation.

The University has seven well-furnished hostels separately for boys and girls in both the campuses with a total capacity of more than 1300 inmates. Rooms are spacious, clean, airy and well maintained with attached bathrooms. Each room is fitted with fan, lights and hard furniture - beds, wardrobes, study tables and chairs. Central air-cooling facilityis also provided for each room. Round-the-clock power back-up facility is available in the campus. Air-conditioned rooms are also available on request. Solar heaters have been installed for providing hot water. Water purifiers and water coolers are in place and regular maintenanceis taken care of these equipments. The mess menu was modified to include lemonade in order to boost the immunity of the students. All rooms in the hostels have Internet connections. The pollution-free environment adds to the healthy living conditions on the campus. Architecturally, the hostels are aesthetically laid out with plenty of open space and a lot of greenery. Each wing of the hostel has verandahs and balconies.





All the hostels have mess facilities at very moderate rates, common hall, TV room, reading rooms, telephone, recreational and sports facilities with a tight security system. The students are allowed to use their own computer in the rooms.

The University takes pains to give its students a neat and clean environment and a comfortable place to live in. There are Wardens and Attendants on duty round the clock. The inmates of a hostel are encouraged to live in harmony, like one big family, helping each other, mutually cooperating to make hostel life a rich and fruitful experience.

Faculty Accommodation

Since teachers belonging to far-off places teach in the University campus, therefore the university has made necessary arrangements for their lodging in the University campus. For

this, flats have been constructed for teachers so that they can devote their full time and energy for improving the academic standard of the students. Centrally situated, the teachers' flats are at a walking distance from academic blocks. With spacious and well-ventilated rooms and serene surroundings, the teachers' flats offer ideal living conditions. Pest Control and sanitization exercises were regularly extended to staff residences. Transport facility is also provided for families of staff members.

Sports/ Playgrounds-Area for Growth

Ample sports facilities have been created on the Campus for the all-round development of students. This facilitates individuals to imbibe sportsman spirit, develop social values and to be humble in victory and gracious in defeats and a spirit of co-operation, discipline, honesty and integrity. Besides vast playgrounds and several playrooms, the University has facilities for a number of indoor and outdoor games. Students are encouraged to engage in social and cultural activities. Cafeteria

The shopping complex also has a Xerox Machine which comes in handy for the students while preparing notes etc. The Complex opens early in the morning and remains open until late in the night. All furniture there has undergone routine inspection and maintenance services.

Transportation

There is a fleet of buses, cars and others to provide uninterrupted transport facility to the students and staff from their residence and back. Students from the adjoining area (within a radius of 50-60 kms) normally avail the University transport facility. Well maintained cars are being used by the officers of the university and also for picking/dropping the guests visiting the University. All buses and cars undergo routine inspection and maintenance services. Regular sanitization exercise are carried out. The buses have been upgraded with fastags and GPS system in compliance with the order received from Ministry of Roadways.



Waste Water Treatment

The University has two plants for waste water treatment and re-use. All the waste water after treatment is used for irrigation. We also separate plastics; metals and paper waste at the source itself and prepare it for recycling. Food waste is composted constantly. All plants undergone routine inspection and maintenance services.

Construction and Maintenance Facilities

The University has a well-developed unit of Works and Plants for undertaking various maintenance works at the University campus. It has three separate wings of electrical, water and construction to take up new work and look after the repair and maintenance of the existing buildings and installations.

Special facilities for students of weaker sections, physically handicapped and women

The University has been strictly following the reservation policy for SC/ST/OBC/SBC and physically handicapped candidates, for admission of the students and appointments to teaching and non-teaching posts.

The University continues to encourage the women students to join various programs by providing them hostel and other facilities on priority. Since inception of the University, the percentage of women students admitted to various courses has been fairly high. To protect the women from sexual harassment, Internal Complaint Committee is already functional. The Women Development Cell is working on the University campus for the welfare and empowerment of the women. Jagannath University Balika Shiksha Sambal Yojana is continuing for the benefit of five BPL girl students. The students covered under this scheme are provided free education.



Admission Procedure

The University ensures wide publicity and transparency in admission through advertisement in news-papers, organizing career fairs, contact programmes, personal counseling events, visits to schools and colleges and television announcements. Admission in different programs is merit based as per the rank obtained in the Common Entrance Test or marks obtained in qualifying examinations followed by GD and interview. The University follows the reservation policy of the Government by allotting seats to all reserved categories, women, sports persons and physically disabled candidates. The high quality of its intake has enabled the University to maintain its commitment to excellence in teaching and research.

The University accepts students from any of the recognized National/ State Level Entrance Examinations in Engineering, Management, Law, Education, Agriculture, Architecture, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy and Allied Health Sciences. The students with valid score card in JEE-Main, MAT, CAT, UJET, CLAT, PTET, JET etc. are considered provided they fulfill

minimum eligibility criteria of the University. The University has been officially enrolled under JEE, MAT examinations for admission to the University.

Human Resource - A Precious Asset

At Jagan Nath University, we pride ourselves in having a team of dedicated, experienced and highly qualified faculty comprising of academicians, researchers, professionals, administrators and managers who, through motivation, counseling and training, prepare the students to meet the challenges of the modern era. They carry out consultancy assignments to keep in touch with the real life management problems in public and private corporations, financial institutions, national and international organizations. They guide the students to become entrepreneurs, researchers and consultants through their vast experience and focus on the overall growth of the individual.

In addition to the permanent teachers, there is a rich pool of visiting faculty from the best academic institutions and leading professionals from the corporate world with rich industry experience. They encourage the students to look beyond the books and explore the subject with experimental learning.

Teachers are encouraged to adopt alternative teaching methods with more use of ICT tools. The teachers are also encouraged to attend seminars/webinars, conferences, workshop, training programmes for which liberal grant is given by the University. In the academic year 2022-23, the faculty has published a more than 100 research papers/ book chapters in national and international journals / books and has attended 104 seminars, conferences and workshops. They have published a total number of 03 books. A total 23 research scholars have successfully completed their Ph.D. degree.

Curriculum

The quality of higher education is regularly upgraded in such a manner that young minds are able to compete in their respective fields globally in terms of their knowledge and skills. The University is following the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) since academic year 2015-16 as per the guidelines laid down by the UGC and this year the University has implemented NEP 2020 features in the curriculum.

Incorporation of Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework in all the programmes makes it student-centric, interactive and outcome-oriented to achieve well-defined aims, objectives and goals. The learning outcomes are attained by students through skills acquired during a programme of study. Programme learning outcomes include subject-specific skills and generic skills, including transferable global skills and competencies. It also focuses on knowledge and skills that prepare students for further study, employment and society/ community development.

It helps ensure comparability of learning levels and academic standards across colleges/universities. The attainment process of outcomes has been initiated from this academic session.

Apart from that keeping in view the National and International scenario, the University is actively pursuing continuous updating of teaching curricula, designing courses on emerging areas and identifying research priorities with a focus on the problems and needs of the people.

Summer Internship

In order to retain the focus of the students on the academic programmes and to compliment it with relevant work experience during the two-month long summer break, the University ensures internships to all its students. The main objective is to provide an edge to the students towards better placement opportunities on completion of their degrees. It is also to give them a feel of the real work settings they would possibly be associated in their professional careers. The organisations facilitating internship, cover a broad spectrum of the industry, government, academic institutions, health institutions, NGOs, media etc.

The respective departments, in association with the facilitating organisations, monitor the work of the interns' regularly. The feedback from the company guide is also taken after the completion of their internship to increase the effectiveness of the scheme.

Research and Extension Facilities

The Research Development Centre (RDC), a nodal center to foster the research activities in various multidisciplinary areas has been established to explore cutting edge high tech research in the frontier areas of engineering, management, law, Information Technology, agriculture, allied health sciences etc.

The University continues to give priority to encourage research and the efforts that have been made in this direction include:

- Identification and appointment of eminent scholars as faculty members.
- Encouraging and providing funds to faculty to undergo advanced training in India and foreign countries.
- Provides assistance and facilities for funded research projects.
- Deputing faculty under exchange programmes.
- Encouraging faculty to attend National and International Conferences.
- Recognizing the good research work of faculty and students.

Corporate Resource Management Centre

The Corporate Resource Management Centre facilitates a larger industry-academia interface for the University. It is a nodal Centre for academia and industry for mutual interaction towards growth and development of employability skills. The Centre focuses on seeking wider industry participation in the academic processes particularly for curriculum designing and delivery. It helps and encourages faculty to seek industry assignments and use the same as a source of updating their practical insight to aquaint the students. This has also opened up possibilities of bringing real life corporate experience to enhance the interactive teaching-learning process.

Orientation Programme

An orientation programme was conducted during September 11–16, 2023 to welcome the new students in the academic session 2023-24 of the University. As per UGC Quality Mandate, the University organized 06 days DEEKSHARAMBH - Student Induction Program (SIP) for the newly admitted students during session 2023-24.

During the general orientation, the UG and diploma students were given detailed account of the curriculum, academic requirements and policies. The students were given a virtual campus tour to familiarize them with the facilities and resources available on campus. They met the teachers of the first semester courses for briefing. Similar sessions were organized programme-wise for the PG students, with emphasis on the details of the curriculum and the available options with regard to elective courses. The newly admitted students were also given orientation towards library to introduce them to the library collection, services and the use of electronic resources, they were also introduced to students welfare functions and activities by DSW (Dean Students Welfare), IIC (Institution Innovation Cell), CGCC (Centre for Guidance and Career Counselling), Training and Placement Cell of the university etc.

Holistic Development

Overall development is as critical as academic excellence. The University therefore, emphasizes the all-round development of its students which aims at producing not only good professionals, but also good and worthy citizens of a great country, aiding in its overall progress and development. The University endeavors to provide best preparation and training to every student for achieving her/his career ambitions and life goals and help them gain a healthy thirst for knowledge and a determination to succeed, while retaining traditional values of discipline, respect and sincerity in all their endeavors. Each teacher mentors a group of students assigned as mentee. The mentors guide each student in their academics as well as personal lives, throughout the duration of their program. The Mentor –Mentee program has been identified as a crucial pillar in execution of the program.

Efficient Governance - Strategic Working

Good Governance forms the bedrock of any world-class organization or University. The governance structure at Jagan Nath University is modeled to evolve a system that helps to draw

upon the strengths of academic community and industry professionals. From day one, the University has the good fortune to have distinguished personalities as its Presidents who gave direction to the institution in its formative years. These visionaries left no stone unturned in making the institution one of the best in the country.

The University is headed by the Chairperson who remains constantly in touch with the President and advises him on the functioning of the University. The Board of Management, Academic Council, Finance Committee, Board of Studies, Departmental Research Committee, Examination Committee, Library Committee & Admission Committee are the University authorities to regulate and monitor the governance of the University on all academic and financial matters and also to frame the rules and regulations. The meetings of The Board of Management, Academic Councils and Finance Committee were held regularly as per the schedule approved by the University. The President is supported by Pro-President, Deans of the faculties, Head of the Departments, Registrar, Controller of Examinations, Chief Finance and Accounts Officer and other officers and staff. The University followed an academic calendar of events. The University ensures the implementation of reservation and other educational policy of the State Government of Rajasthan.

Functioning smoothly, following the provisions of the Acts and Statutes, the administration has been streamlined to ensure efficiency reflected in maintaining the schedule of admissions, in completing the courses, conduct of examinations, declaration of results and conducting research, etc. As a guiding principle for a fair administration, Faculty of the University is associated with the process of decision making at various levels. Students, too, are associated with the various administrative channels related to their education, curricula and hostel accommodation. Thus, in the pyramid of administration from top to bottom, all the segments of the University have made their respective contribution to the regularity and responsive administration of the University.

Teaching-Learning Process

Teaching-learning processes at the University are ever evolving and innovative. The teaching learning process manifests efforts to realize learner centered approach and technology orientation. They are monitored with work plans and the predetermined academic calendar of events. Use of information and communication technology is enhance through use of ICT tools and activity based learning. Students' involvement in learning is realized by means of project work, paper presentations, case studies, excursions, group discussions and industrial visits etc. Plays and organization of exhibitions in the university also help students to increase their commitment to the subject. Students are motivated to take part in various debates, elocution and other similar competitions, which promote their analytical thinking. The students of the University have won various positions in extra mural activities in various competitions. Center for Guidance and Career Counseling regularly conducts sessions to improve the communication skills, preparation for competitive exams and counseling for progression of the students.

IV. INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Quality development, enhancement and sustenance are the key words reverberating in most institutions of higher learning today. Since quality enhancement is a continuous process, the IQAC will become a part of University system and work towards realizing the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop and maintain a system for constant improvement in the performance of University. IQAC has been making constant efforts to meet its aims and objectives through following measures in the session 2023-24:

- 1. All 3-year UG programs are being offered as 4-year UG Framework.
- 2. Offering interdisciplinary value added courses.
- 3. Offers a course on Indian Knowledge System in various disciplines and experts sessions are conducted to provide insight on IKS.
- 4. Various MOUs with the industry for pre-placement trainings and skill enhancement.
- 5. MOOCs integrated in curriculum
- 6. Assessment focuces CCE mode of evaluation.
- 7. Implementation of ABC ID and results declaration through ABC ID only.
- 8. Research Methodology course mandatory in all UG programs.
- 9. Students to published research/article/ patents mentored by faculty members.
- 10. Research Ethics Committee fully functional.
- 11. Expansion of placement office to enhance placement activities
- 12. The financial support to teachers for publication and participation is provided since inception.

V. THE ACADEMIC SYSTEM

The Academic System of Jagan Nath University, Jaipur has been designed such that it promotes realization of Founders' Vision of 'developing this University as a Centre of Excellence for higher education and research committed towards quality education, skill development, industry integration and holistic eco-system for global competencies among youth and sustainable development of the Nation'. The academic system focuses on providing education that helps learners acquiring professional skills through in-depth study of discipline specific courses as well as broad knowledge of the wider world. The basic objective is to provide students right type of education and preparing them to deal with challenges of modern organizations characterized by complexity, diversity and change in the new economy. The emphasis is on promoting interdisciplinary and multi-disciplinary perspectives of learning along with study in major subjects. The system is in full consonance with the UGC guidelines on Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and New Education Policy (NEP), 2020 framework. The features of CBCS which include flexibility in the choice of courses and credits, continuous evaluation process, uniform grading system, and courses classification into core, electives, ability enhancement compulsory courses and skill development courses are in-built in the process. The salient features of NEP including multidisciplinary and holistic education approach, ethics and human values, extensive use of technology in education delivery, outstanding research, outcome based assessments, community services, etc. have also been incorporated in academic system. The CBCS provides for flexibility in designing curriculum with Mark to Market approach and assign credits based on course content and hours of teaching. It accelerates the teaching-learning process and enables vertical and horizontal mobility in learning. To enhance quality standards the system lays special emphasis on research, innovations, skill development, technology and human values in learning process. The four pillars that drive the university education at Jagan Nath University are quality education, skill development, holistic approach and industry integration. This academic system applies to all UG and PG programs offered by the University.

Programs

The University offers UG and PG programs in various disciplines.

Type of Courses

Courses in a program of study are classified into four categories i.e. Core, Electives, Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).

1. Core Courses

These are the courses which are to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement to complete the degree in a program of study. They are compulsory courses generally given in the beginning semester(s) to build up basic knowledge in any academic program. The

weightage for this category is suggested to be 15-20 percent of the total degree credit requirements.

2. Elective Courses

Elective course is a course which can be chosen from a pool of subjects. It may be

- a. Supportive to the discipline of study
- b. Providing an expanded scope
- c. Enabling an exposure to some other discipline/domain
- d. Nurturing students proficiency/skills

They are the depth courses designed to achieve any/all of the above objectives in any degree Program. They help build expertise and skills in the degree domain area.

Further, elective courses may be divided into two categories i.e. Generic Centric/Open Elective and Discipline Centric/Specific Elective. 'Generic Elective' refers to those courses which add generic proficiency to the students and may be chosen from unrelated discipline. 'Discipline Centric' adds to subject expertise and are offered under the main discipline/ subject of study.

The weightage for electives in degree Program is suggested to be 60 percent.

3. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses

AECC are based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. For example, English Communication, Environment Studies, Disaster Management, Computer Application, Community Service, etc.

4. Skill Enhancement Courses

SEC courses provide value based and/or skill based knowledge and may have content both Theory and Lab/Training/Field Work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life skills and hands on skills so as to improve their employability.

The weightage for category 3 & 4 above is suggested to be 20-25 percent of the total credits.

However, keeping in view the nature and specific requirements of any degree Program there may be some variations in the relative weightage with in the categories as suggested above.

5. Value-Added Courses (VAC)

Courses under Value Added, Summer Internship/ Apprenticeship/ Community outreach activities, etc.,

6. Multi-disciplinary

The courses from other disciplines integrated across the sciences, social sciences, arts, humanities, and sports for a multidisciplinary approach.

Salient Features

The Academic System of the University has the following features:

Choice Based Credit System

The system reflects implementation of the UGC guidelines on Choice Based Credit System. The semester system is followed to implement CBCS in all the Programs.

Freedom of Choice of Courses

The students may take up any subject offered by the University after checking its availability and pre-requisite requirements.

• Freedom of Choice of Credits

A UG student is expected to take on an average 20 credits per semester. This limit may increase or decrease by 5 credits as per individual choice and capacity.

• Pillars of Academic Systems

Quality Education, Skill Development, Industry Integration, Holistic Approach with focus on Human Values are the main pillars of academic system philosophy followed by the University and the same is reflected in course curriculum content and pedagogy of each Program.

Multidisciplinary Approach

In each program there is a provision for general and liberal education courses in addition to discipline domain courses.

Outcome Based Curriculum

The curriculum of all the programs have been defined as per the outcome based guidelines highlighting PEOs, POs and COs.

Transfer of Credit Policy

The credit transfer policy facilitates the mobility from one course to the other and transfer of credits earned through MOOCs, Coursera and other online certifications.

Mark to Market Approach

It gives freedom to teachers in designing the curriculum in response to the changing requirements of industry and employability. Course up-gradation is a regular feature.

Focus on Research

Research is an integral part of course curriculum in UG and PG programs. The students may take real time live projects on regular basis in addition to major research project.

• Continuous Evaluation System

In all programs continuous evaluation system is followed which carries 30% weightage in evaluation process.

• Minimum Degree Requirements

The minimum credit requirements to qualify for degree are fixed for each program. A student will have the freedom to take extra courses and credits to enhance skill sets.

Classification of Courses

In each program, the courses are classified into core, electives, ability enhancement and skill enhancement, Value-Added Courses (VAC), multi-disciplinary categories. AECC courses are mandatory for the students across disciplines. This category includes courses on English Communication, Environment Studies, Disaster Management, Computer Applications, Community Service, etc.

• Internship and Major Research Project

Industry internships and major research project are the essential components of curriculum in all UG and PG programs in the University.

Other Unique Features

(i) Language Laboratory

The Language Laboratory is used for language tutorials. These are attended by the students who voluntarily opt for Remedial English Classes. Lessons and exercises were recorded on weekly basis so that the students are exposed to a variety of listening and speaking drills. This especially benefits students who are deficient in English and aims at confidence building for interview and competitive examinations. The Language Laboratory sessions also included word games, quizzes, extemporary speaking, debates, skits etc.

(ii) Practical Training

Besides meticulous academic teaching, an emphasis was given on practical training for professional career of the students. Rural camp, study tour, seminar, guest lectures by visiting experts, and term-end review are some of the mandatory but noncredit components of the teaching programme for the major programs run by the Faculty. In different ways, each of these activities contributed towards enhancing social sensitivity. Activities imparting skills for problem solving, situational analysis, reflection, action were conducted through participatory research, creative writing, small group assignments, paper presentation, discussions at formal and online platforms.

(iii) Learner Oriented Planning

Routine class teaching and the intensive interaction with the students and performance in internal assessment and mid-term examinations enables the teachers to identify slow and advanced learners who are then given assistance to improve their academic competence.

Summer courses of 4-6 weeks duration were organized for slow learners while advanced learners were encouraged to participate in seminars/workshops etc. In addition, students were also encouraged to enroll themselves on the SWAYAM platform for MOOCs.

(iv) Mentor-Mentee System

The teacher takes on the role of a facilitator. The teachers are assigned students as mentees to be supported and helped for proper learning and development throughout the degree program. The teachers guides and hand holds the mentee for both academic and personal growth. Students are also encouraged to frequentely use library for research and study. Mentors guide the mentees to become the member of related club/s in the University as per their interest. The program was successful in shaping the personality of the students, resulting in 85.00 percent placement of final year students across all disciplines.

The teachers adopted presentation and group discussion method to make the topic more interesting. The teachers frequently gave the illustrations and discussed the topics to acquaint the students with the practical insight of the subject.

Feedback System: First Hand Improvement

The University follows the mechanism of student evaluation of teachers to improve the teaching-learning process. The University has developed questionnaire suitable to all departments to undertake student feedback on courses, departments, teachers, campus, and support system at the end of every semester. At the end of each semester, the feedback was collected from students and detailed analysis of the feedback was carried out by IQAC and presented to the academic council. A feedback was also collected from teachers, alumni as well as from the parents. A detailed analysis of the feedback was carried out by IQAC andpresented to the academic council. If the response regarding the performance of any teacher is not within expectation then authorities guided and encouraged concerned teacher for improvement in substance and technique. The feedback mechanism serves as a crucial platform to improve the infrastructural facilities, teaching - learning process and basic amenities in the University.

Examination System - Benchmarking Excellence

The University examination system is based on the philosophy of continuous teaching and evaluation. The University follows the semester system with Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) implemented in the academic year 2015-16 as per the guidelines laid down by the UGC. External experts do setting up of question papers and they evaluate the answer books also. At the end of each semester, students have to meet the minimum criteria of academic performance stipulated in University's Regulations to be promoted to the next semester. There is a zero tolerance for unfair means in the examination.

The University works with utmost ethics, transparency, non-interference, accountability and decentralization. It has a well organized and transparent Examination System. The University makes every attempt to make the teaching, learning and evaluation process to be effective and innovative. The conduct of Examinations is systematic, methodical, prompt and transparent and is held as per the schedule. There is provision for revaluation and rechecking available at UG and PG level. The University follows academic calendar for semester/annual system which includes examination, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities which facilitates and enables the systematic working and conduction of exams.

Continuous assessment based on student's performance and participation in the class on daily basis throughout the term, assignments, projects, term exams followed by tests, problems or case studies is an integral part of the evaluation of a student's performance. The examination system has a provision for scrutiny of answer books by the students.

Training & Placement - First Step to the World of Work

Placements at the University is a regular activity. The University has a dedicated 'Training & Placement Office' headed by Training and Placement Officer. The Training & Placement Office aims at making available quality placement opportunities for students and at maintaining linkages with Human Resource Departments of leading companies working in various domains across the country.

The placement office initiated Pre-placement training for final year students before commencing the placement drive. Various other activities and initiatives were also taken to collaborate with industry. The cell organized mock interviews and group discussions in collaboration with corporate trainers to familiarize students with standard selection procedures. Renowned organizations were invited to participate in the placement process.

The University has also maintained close linkage with industry and other organizations, so that students of various disciplines can visit their plants to get a direct insight into the multifunctional processes at these organizations. In-plant training is also organized as per the program curriculum. Apart from this, all the programs have trainings and internships for which the training and placement office provides opportunities way ahead before the semester exams.

Placement drives started in November-December keeping in view the University calendar. The cell was able to deliver 70.00 percent placement of final year students across all disciplines.

Linkage /Tie up with the Industry

The University realises that industry and academia collaboration is the way forward to achieve excellence in higher education. This helps the faculty to familiarize themselves with industrial practices and share the same with the students in the form of case studies to make

teaching-learning interesting. To have linkage with the industry, the University is done various MoUs and through these provided opportunities to both the teachers and students to work with industry for various projects/ internships/ trainings. Researchers were encouraged to work on practical problems faced by the industry that will be fruitful for both research and industry.

Co-Curricular Activities - Overall Learning

In order to ensure that the students have effective learning experience, the University organized debates, essay writing, elocution and other competitions in both offline and online mode according to academic calendar to improve and sustain the academic quality of the students. The faculty ensured that the students have effective learning experiences through their problem solving skills. The University believes that the students who are given the freedom to explore areas based on their personal interests, and who are accompanied in their learning by a supportive, understanding facilitator, not only achieve superior academic results but also develop socially and grow personally. A well-maintained, separate computer laboratory with internet facility is accessible to the students. They can access latest changes and developments taking place in their respective domains, inhigher education across the globe.

Extension Activities

Various extension activities were organized in the neighborhood community for creating and impact and sensitizing students on social issues and holistic development. The Department of Law and Women Development Cell organized Legal Aid Awareness Camp, Legal Literacy Camp in the adopted villages. Legal aid camp and awareness on legal rights for women organized to make community and students of the University aware about issues related to gender parity. Department of Pharmacy organized a Blood Donation Drive and Department of Physiotherapy organized health checkup camp for medical fitness in nearby community. University organized Yoga camps through the department of Naturopathy. Various extension activities like AIDS awareness, Environmental Awareness, water quality monitoring were organized. Community capacity building and livelihood programmes were also organized. In an effort towards development of social sensitivities and good citizenship qualities among the students, most of the departments integrate community outreach programmes into their curricular activities. Through extension and outreach activities students develop skills and aptitude for critical thinking, problem solving and acquires leadership, communication, and analytical skills. Students gain an understanding of social justice, value, responsibility, and sustainability.

Convocation

The University organized its 10th convocation on Saturday April 21, 2024 to award degrees to the UG, PG and Ph.D. graduates who completed their degree programs in 2023. Prof. (Dr.) V.K. Agarwal, Pro-Chancellor, Jagannath Gupta Memorial Society was the Chief Guest on this occasion.

The Event

The Faculty of Law Organised a Extension Lecture related to Forensic Science.Dr. Girish Kumar Mathur, Worked as forensic scientists for about 35 years in State forensic Science Laboratory of Rajasthan who gave knowledge about Forensic science and its relation with law to our students. In his lecture he discussed that Forensic science is a discipline that functions within the parameters of the legal system and may have a remarkable contribution in supporting justice in crime investigation and other serious violations. Its purpose is to provide guidance to those conducting criminal investigations through the recognition and retrieval of evidence at crime scenes and accurate information on which they can rely on the resolution of criminal and civil disputes. Crime includes murder, rape, accidentrelated incidents, undisclosed persons, displaced persons, fraud-related cases, and forgery. Forensic Science is described as "applying science to statutes enacted in criminal justice by law enforcement agencies." Forensic Science is concerned with the application of scientific concepts and methods of the various science disciplines to legal matters. The proof analysis consists of multiple areas such as sociology, physics, forensic chemistry and biology, DNA profiling, computer science, and engineering. Physics, for example, is used to understand the blueprint of a blood dispersion; biochemistry seeks to strengthen the basis for an unverified suspect, and chemistry helps us to find out the chemical composition of different drugs.

Forensic science is an integration of nearly all scientific skills and acts as a critical and qualified tool that makes the dispensation of justice possible in criminal, civil, legislative, and social contexts. It helps to describe all of science's applications in addressing the questions of legal significance. Forensic science is now a highly advanced research method used in criminal and civil investigations,

able to address critical questions and an integral part of the criminal justice system. It includes all renowned techniques such as the analysis of fingerprints, DNA analysis, ballistics and explosives, firearms, culture, etc.

The legal system clearly understands the role that forensic evidence plays in criminal trials. This is because there isn't much room for bias or discrimination while using scientific techniques and methods. This is why profiling of DNA and a variety of other forensic evidence are commonly recognized in courts around the world. Interestingly, the Chinese (650 A.D.) dates back to the first forensic technique ever used that involved finger and palm print recognition.

Forensic testimony is commonly used across the world for both convicting and exonerating suspects. Thus, forensic science labs have been mushrooming across the globe over the past few decades. In addition, Special Acts have been passed to enhance the delivery of forensic services in the <u>US</u>, <u>Canada</u> and <u>Australia</u>. This ensures greater certainty in the detection of crimes, and consequently, rates of conviction may increase. Such Acts place great emphasis on timely and high-quality crime scene management.

The forensic proof is often used for both defendants who have been convicted and acquitted. As a consequence, the number of crime laboratories throughout the world has increased significantly over the last couple of decades. Special acts have been implemented in the United States, Canada, Great Britain and Australia in order to improve the forensic status of criminals and thereby enable convictions to increase. They stress the timely and quality management of the crime scene. In 1878, India set up the first official crime lab. Around 35 forensic labs now in the country are limited to unique facts. The growing rank and file in the field of forensic sciences and the fundamental role forensic evidence plays in numerous criminal cases has driven up the increase in the numbers of criminals laboratories. A constantly evolving world raises the burden on law enforcement agencies to collect better facts. The news media highlight the importance of forensic science but also focus on errors in locating and identifying in high profile cases.

Expert testimonials offer an important informational source in international criminal proceedings, and forensic expertise is no exception: the ad hoc trials and judgments have been based on findings from exhumations and examinations. While issues relating to the relationship between law and science have been explored within the domains of national judicial systems, the mixed court system presents a solid debate with new contexts. An officer with further forensic studies could be overconfident and unintentionally taint evidence, making it inadmissible. Instead, given the current lack of adequate collection of substantial evidence from the crime scene (if not trampled underfoot and completely ignored), proper training will be more likely to improve the situation rather than worsen it, if competent forensic science instructors are able to carry out it. In the Indian case, greater focus was put on the use of these technologies in criminal investigations and trials. Commissions appointed on criminal justice reforms have affirmed that the introduction of crime detection technologies will enable the system to work efficiently. The related laws have been changed from time to time to make room for the use of forensic technologies in investigating and prosecuting crime. And yet, it can be argued that the regulations that need to be revised have current flaws. Also, due to their conservative approach, the courts are reluctant to rely on empirical evidence, or other inherent flaws in the evidence presented in court, which prevent them from relying entirely on it. Criminal justice system's primary motto is to have equal justice. The forensic proof is, no doubt, more credible than eye testimony.


Being a scientific method, forensic science is a boon to the criminal justice system. To progress, we need to overcome the existing flaws. Around the same time, there is a need to ensure that law enforcement and investigative agencies once again understand and use forensic science as a holistic problem-solving resource to their full potential. It is apparent that such a technique is incorporated within a context that enables an understanding of the input that a particular form of evidence may provide meaningfully in terms of sub-source, source, operation or offence-level proposals for a given

collection of case-specific circumstances rather than restricting it to a one-dimensional reactive procedure. An interpreted means of evaluative monitoring of forensic science data pertinent to a specific case but retained in the context of that case where alternate solution propositions can be attended to and challenged correctly, works to fulfil this problem-solving prospects. Such a method has been developed by the Association of Forensic Science Suppliers among others.









A question-and-answer session with Dr. Manvi allowed students to clarify doubts and seek guidance on career prospects in the field of laboratory technology.








E Quiz on Jal Shakti Abhiyan

Chandrayaan-3 is the third mission in the a series of missions developed by the <u>Indian Space Research Organisation</u> (ISRO). Launched on 14 July 2023, the mission consists of a <u>lunar lander</u> named <u>Vikram</u> and a <u>lunar rover</u> named <u>Pragyan</u>, similar to those launched aboard Chandrayaan-2 in 2019.

Chandrayaan-3 was launched from <u>Satish Dhawan Space Centre</u> on 14 July 2023. The spacecraft entered lunar orbit on 5 August, and the lander touched down near the <u>Lunar south pole</u> on 23 August at 18:03 <u>IST</u> (12:33 <u>UTC</u>), making India the fourth country to successfully <u>land on the Moon</u>, and the first to do so near the lunar south pole.

Ganpati Poojan and Visarjan

Ganesh Chaturthi also known as Vinayak Chaturthi or Ganeshotsav is a Hindu festival that tributes Hindu deity Ganesha. The festival is marked with the installation of Ganesha's clay murtis (devotional representations of a deity) privately in homes and publicly on elaborate pandals (temporary stages). Observances include chanting of Vedic hymns and Hindu texts, such as prayers and vrata (fasting). Offerings and prasada from the daily prayers, which are distributed from the pandal to the community, include sweets such as modak as it is believed to be a favourite of Lord Ganesha. The festival ends on the tenth day after start, when the Murti is carried in a public procession with music and group chanting, then immersed in a nearby body of water such as a river or sea, called Visarjan on the day of Ananta Chaturdashi.

Regarding the festival celebration University, Department of Student Welfare organized nine days celebration starting form sthapna to till visarjan from $19^{th} - 27^{th}$ September, 2023 at University campus Chaksu. Along with students staff members also participated in the nine days event. The Event completely coordinated by the hostel students under the observation of Hostel Wardens Deputy Registrar, Dean Student Welfare and Vice Chancellor also. 330 Students participated in the event. 


Figure 3 : Swachhata Hi Seva, 1.10.23






Figure 3: Figure 4:



E Quiz on Khadi Mahotsav



Regarding this Jagannath University Organized an online quiz for students and staff members.






Bhartiya Bhasha Diwas










Figure 17: Spandan, 22.12.23


Figure 40: Spandan, 23.12.23



National Youth Day Celebration








Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Initiative (BBBP)


Figure 3 : Republic Day, 26.1.24


Project- Model Making Competition & Exhibition Day on National Science Day


Figure 11: Iron War Power Lifting Tournament, 27.4.24 Figure 12:






The ceremony was conducted at 10:00 am at the Chaksu campus, block A.78 Students along with some faculty members have participated in this pledge.




Figure 3: Figure 4:






Figure 5: Figure 6:

Having embarked on his journey in the development sector by living and working for several years among remote forest based tribal communities in the southern Indian district of Mysuru, Dr. R. Balasubramaniam (Balu) is a widely respected development activist, leadership trainer, thinker and writer. After his MBBS, he earned his MPhil in Hospital Administration & Health Systems Management from BITS, Pilani. He has a Master's in Public Administration from the Harvard Kennedy School, Harvard University. His living habits were greatly influenced by the teachings of Swami Vivekananda and at the age of 19, he founded the Swami Vivekananda Youth Movement based on the principles of Ahimsa, Satya, Seva and Tyaga. He has spent more than three decades of his life in the service of the rural and tribal poor in the forests of India. He is also the Founder and Chairman of Grassroots Research and Advocacy Movement, a public policy thinktank in India.

Dr Balu embodies a rare blend of grassroots and macro perspectives and policy through his multi-faceted experience of more than three decades. He is a Tata Scholar, a Mason Fellow of the Harvard Kennedy School and a Fellow at the Hauser Center for Civil Society, Harvard University. He was the Head and Visiting Professor of the Vivekananda Chair, University of Mysore twice.

He is currently a visiting professor at Cornell University, USA and at IIT-Delhi, India where he teaches courses on Leadership and Human Development. He coaches and mentors senior leaders in the non-profit, corporate, government and educational sectors globally, apart from running leadership workshops for people from these sectors. He is the Chairman of the Social Stock Exchange Advisory Committee set up by SEBI. He is currently the Member-HR in the Capacity Building Commission of the Government of India.


The Event

The objective of the activity were:


- 1. To Raise Environmental Awareness



A basic health check-up camp was held in Mahachandpura to promote health awareness and offer free medical assistance to villagers. This initiative was designed to provide healthcare access to people with limited access to medical services and enhance awareness regarding common health issues.

Distribute necessary medicines and hygiene kits.

Services Provided

The camp offered the following services:

General Health Check-up: Measurement of height, weight, blood pressure, and

temperature.

Vision and Dental Hygiene awareness

Women's Health : Basic health awareness with a focus on maternal health,

anemia, and nutrition.

Child Health and Immunizations Schedule awareness

Health Education : Awareness sessions on hygiene, nutrition, family planning, and

preventive measures against seasonal illnesses.

Observations and Findings:

Prevalent Health Issues: High cases of anemia, respiratory issues, and minor skin infections were noted among the population.

Awareness Needs: Limited awareness about personal hygiene, nutrition, and preventive health practices.

Follow-up Requirements: Certain cases were advised for further check-ups at nearby health centers for specialized care.

Outcome

Beneficiaries : Over 75 villagers benefited from the camp.

Medicines Distributed : Common medications for infections, pain relief, multivitamins,

and iron supplements were provided.

Patients needing advanced medical care were advised to approach relevant doctors- hospitals.

The health awareness camp in Mahachandpura was successful in providing necessary health services and raising awareness about preventive health practices. A need for regular health camps and increased focus on education about hygiene and nutrition was observed to improve overall community health.




