






"Emerging Technologies in Mechanical Engineering"




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"3D Concrete Printers: Emerging Technology in Construction Field"


"Women's Safety"









"Srijan" - National Level Business Plan Competition



"World Environment Day"




(E) Conclusion:





शिक्षा राष्ट्रीय विकास की आधारशिला है। शिक्षा के बिना कोई भी राष्ट्र विकसित नहीं हो सकता। शिक्षा का कार्य राष्ट्र की प्रगति और विकास को गति देना है। शिक्षा ही एक ऐसा साधन है जो राष्ट्रीय एकता लाता है। किसी राष्ट्र की शैक्षिक उपलब्धि, राष्ट्रीय गौरव का सूचक भी होती है।

पूर्व.ब्रिटिश, पाठशालाओं, गुरुकुलों, गुरुद्वारों और अन्य धार्मिक संगठनों में स्वदेशी माध्यमिक शिक्षा प्रदान की जाती थी। महिलाओं और अनुसूचित वर्गों और गरीब लोगों के लिए शिक्षा पर प्रतिबंध लगा दिया गया था।

बाद में भारत शिक्षा आयोग 1882, शिक्षा नीति पर सरकारी प्रस्ताव 1904, गोपाल कृष्ण गोखले के संकल्प 1911, हरतोग सिमति 1929, वर्धा योजना 1938 और सार्जेंट रिपोर्ट 1944 जैसे कई आयोग और सिमतियां स्थापित की गईं। उन सभी ने मुफ्त और अनिवार्य शिक्षा पर जोर दिया।

भारत ने गुरुवार 27 अगस्त 2009 को 86वें संवैधानिक संशोधन द्वारा शिक्षा का अधिकार लागू किया। इसमें कहा गया है राज्य 6 से 14 वर्ष की आयु के सभी बच्चों को इस तरह से मुफ्त और अनिवार्य शिक्षा प्रदान करेगा जैसा कि राज्य, कानून द्वारा निर्धारितकर सकता है।

भारत सबसे पहले शिक्षा को अनिवार्य और सभी के लिए मुफ्त बनाने वाला देश है। औपचारिक शिक्षा सभी को बिना किसी लिंग, जाति, पंथ और रंग के भेदभाव के दी जाती है।

Asian nation presently solely treats twenty-first of Municipal Solid Waste whereas the rest disposed of in unhygienic lowland sites with no usage and treatment technologies. Governing authorities should review the present Municipal Solid Waste management practices, challenges and provides recommendations for Municipal Solid Waste Management for the town of Jaipur in Rajasthan, India.

Despite being the urban center moreover because the high traveler destination in northern a part of Asian nation, there's no elaborate study that reviews the waste management ways of this town together with characteristic the key challenges. Recommendations for improvement embody public awareness campaigns, public-private partnerships, investment in lined landfills, usage, and waste-to-energy techniques. Optimization models and life cycle assessment tools ought to be used to reduce price and also the environmental impact of Municipal Solid Waste management. Policy manufacturers and personal sector stakeholders have to develop ways for future designing, investment, and execution of improved Municipal Solid Waste Management in Indian cities like Jaipur.

China's Territorial Claim On Arunachal Pradesh

China's territorial claim on the Indian state of Arunachal Pradesh has been a major bone of contention between India and China. China bases its claim on the argument that historical ties existed between the Tawang monastery in Arunachal Pradesh and the Lhasa monastery. Hence, the Chinese logic is that given Tibet is now part of China, Arunachal Pradesh should form a part of it. Both countries fought a border war in Arunachal Pradesh in 1962 and the situation remains unpleasant due to repeated Chinese foreign office statements reiterating the claim. The Chinese territorial claim on Arunachal Pradesh has increasingly become an issue of grave concern for Indian foreign policy given China's visible assertiveness on the issue in recent years.

Indian concerns about China's military modernization in Tibet which borders Arunachal Pradesh are also growing. China has upgraded its military presence in Tibet very close to the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in Arunachal Pradesh by replacing its old liquid-fueled, nuclear-capable CSS-3 intermediate-range ballistic missile with "more advanced CSS-5 MRBMs". India has responded to this Chinese military build-up by taking a strategic decision in October 2011 to deploy the Brahmos supersonic cruise missile, which has a flight range of 290 km, in the eastern sector to strengthen its defense posture vis-àvis China.

China's territorial claim on Arunachal Pradesh also has great symbolic resonance for its legitimacy over Tibet. The 400 years old monastery in Tawang was the birthplace of the sixth Dalai Lama in the 17th century and is the second-largest Tibetan monastery after Lhasa. It is plausible that the 14th Dalai Lama chooses his successor from the Tawang monastery. China also perceives that India makes it possible for the Dalai Lama to travel abroad, and his speeches around the world have kept the Tibetan issue alive and questioned Chinese legitimacy over Tibet.

How can India tackle Chinese aggression?

A few things that India can do or should have done to strangle

China are:

1) Construct an international road from North East to Vietnam. This will have multiple benefits: a) India will have direct access to the vicinity of the Hainan naval base; it is the most important naval base of China. India can directly attack the Hainan base from Vietnam if required. b) All the cheap plastic items that we import from China can be now imported from Vietnam. They manufacture the same goods at the same rate. c) Connect Singapore to India via the Vietnam NE corridor. A hell of a lot of business can be done. Malacca Strait is on the tip of Singapore and a lot of goods can be transported by road. d) The underdeveloped North East India will also develop with the international road passing through it.

2) India should collaborate with all the smaller islands which fall on the trade route in the Indian Ocean. Eg, The Cocos island in the Indian ocean; India still doesn't have a military base there. That island belongs to Australia, so India can easily build a base.

- 3) Try to remove the Chinese naval base from Hambantota, Sri Lanka, and construct India's base as the current government in Sri Lanka is pro-India.
- **4)** India should take the advantage of the instability in Yemen and build a base in Socotra Island with the help of the US.


