PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATE IN LOGISTICS

Add on Apprenticeship Programme, an avenue created by Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) and Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE). The programme is aimed at providing necessary skill and attitude to students passing out of colleges in humanities and science streams in order to make them industry ready. The skill and attitude obtained through this programme is expected to augment the employability skills of fresh graduates.

Logistics Sector Skill Council (LSC) offers this programme in various sub-sectors and Qualification Packs (Job Roles) pertaining to Logistics industry, one among the fast growing industries in India. Higher education institutions can help their passing out students in choosing the Logistics Job Roles listed in www.shreyas.ac.in and post the details in the SHREYAS web-portal.

LSC makes arrangements for 120 hours of conceptual learning pertaining to Logistics, and about six months of Apprenticeship training in Logistics companies under the provisions of Apprenticeship Act. Students who take up this programme are eligible for payment of monthly stipend of about Rs.6,000 during the apprenticeship period.

On completion of the apprenticeship period, LSC would assess the students and issue Professional Certificate in Logistics to students who complete the programme successfully. The Certificate and six months of industrial experience would help the students get regular employment in Logistics industry at the supervisory level of management. LSC also provides the much needed placement assistance to the Certified students to get them gainfully employed in Logistics Industry.

Registration of students passing out in April/May 2019 for participation in the programme closes on March 25, 2019. The programme commences in the month of May for this year 2019. Students need not pay any fee for the programme (except a paltry money for assessment, and certification).



This Agreement is entered into By and Between

Jagan Nath University, Jaipur represented by Mr. Tanmay Pattanayak, Registrar (which expression shall unless repugnant or inconsistent with the context or meaning thereof, be deemed to mean and include its business administrators, successors in title, legal representatives and permitted assigns) as the first part;

And

Logistics Sector Skill Council(LSC), established by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) through National Skill Development Corporation of India (NSDC) represented by Capt. T.S. Ramanujam, Chief Executive Officer (which expression shall unless repugnant or inconsistent with the context or meaning thereof, be deemed to mean and include its business administrators, successors in title, legal representatives and permitted assigns) as the other part.

Whereas

The first part is desirous of launching apprenticeship-based Under Graduate Degree Programme in Logistics from the Academic Year 2019-20 in collaboration with LSC.

And the other part, having been mandated to cause creation of skilled human resources for gainful employment in Logistics industry, LSC agrees to offer its expertise for the purpose of launching and conducting apprenticeship-based Under Graduate Degree Programme in Logistics.

Therefore this agreement is entered into between the first part and the other part for a term of five years, that is the term required for completion of the three-year UG programme by three consecutive batches of students admitted from the Academic Year 2019-20 and Calendar Year 2020.

THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Purpose

The objective of this Agreement is for the first part to enter into an understanding with the other
part to enable the first part to launch and efficiently conduct apprenticeship-based Under
Graduate Degree Programme (hereinafter referred as 'Degree') in Logistics from the Academic
Year 2019-20.

2. Obligations of the first part

- a) The first part shall take appropriate steps to get the Degree approved within December 2018 by the various academic bodies like Board of Studies, Academic Council, and University to which it is affiliated/attached with.
- b) The first part and/or the University to which it is affiliated/attached with may modify the Model Regulations and Curriculum (as given in the Appendix A) wherever necessary to suit the local requirements without altering the basic structure and focus of the programme.
- c) The first part and/or the University to which it is affiliated/attached with may modify the suggested evaluation/assessment criteria (as given in the Appendix A) wherever necessary to suit itsnorms, standards, and practices.
- d) The first part shall make available the necessary classrooms, faculty, library, and laboratory resources for the efficient conduct of the Degree.
- e) The first part shall make admission of permitted number of students to the Degree.
- f) The first part shall collect programme fee from students as per its norms or the norms of the University to which it is affiliated/attached with.
- g) The first part shall make all other arrangements for the proper conduct of the Degree as necessitated by the University to which it is affiliated/attached with.
- h) The first part shall periodically provide LSC all necessary data/information about the conduct of the Degree in prescribed format.
- The first part may take necessary steps to popularise the Degree in the region where it operates and facilitate admission of passionate students to the extent of sanctioned intake capacity.
- j) The first part shall take up the Annual Assessment of Academic Process (AAAP) assisted by LSC to continuously improve the process with the objective of graduating industry-relevant manpower.
- k) The first part shall provide accommodation, hospitality, and local conveyance to the visiting experts (two experts per Batch of students) for AAAP.
- The first part shall offer and conduct the Degree only at the agreed Centre. Offering the Degree
 in additional Centres is not permitted by the other part, unless a written agreement is signed
 between the parties.
- m) The first part shall appoint and notify a Faculty Coordinator from its side, who will meet/communicate with the other part on a regular basis and provide necessary guidance, support and review the progress made.

3. Obligations of the other part

The other part shall provide system features and perform incidental services as may be necessary to:

Register first part as a Participating Institution;

b. Develop and continually improve an appropriate curriculum that ensures imparting of Knowledge Skill, and Attitude in every student undergoing the Degree and Nath University.

- c. Provide to the first part the scientifically developed and continuously improved curriculum for implementation;
- d. Allow the first part to use LSC logo, and mention 'in collaboration with LSC' in all its promotional materials/stationery;
- e. Train the faculty members of the first part handling the Degree in the contemporary Teaching-Learning Process for teaching Logistics courses;
- Provide faculty members and students of the first part access to online learning materials;
- g. Source apprenticeship assignment in all Even-Semesters to all students pursuing the Degree in the first part;
- Ensure all student-apprentice of the first part get monthly stipend during the apprenticeship period as per the provisions of Apprenticeship Act, 1961;
- Continuously Assess the performance of students in Apprenticeship, share the assessment results with the first part, and issue Apprenticeship Completion Certificate to students of first part who successfully complete the Apprenticeship;
- Offer appropriate number of Allied Courses in each Even Semester, deliver them online, assess, and issue Completion Certificates;
- Ensure all students of the Degree, on their successful completion of the Degree, are placed at a level commensurate their capability in Logistics Sector;
- Make available to the other part a Regional Panel of Experts for teaching and assessment
- m. Make Annual Assessment of Academic Process (AAAP) of the Degree in the first part, and facilitate it to continuously improve the process with the objective of graduating industryrelevant manpower;
- n. Perform such other duties as may be mutually agreed between the first part and the other part.

4. Reports

- The other part shall provide to the first part data/information on Apprenticeship, Allied Courses, and Final Placement for getting informed about the progress.
- b. The other part shall provide prescribed reports as per requirements to the first part.
- The format, content, periodicity and other information related to reports shall be discussed, approved in writing and finalised with the other part.

Training

- The other part would provide training to the identified faculty members of the first part. Such training shall be conducted either at the premises of the first part or at a common place to facilitate participation by faculty members of other Participating Institutions.
- b. The training shall be conducted in batches of 25 each. The other part will train and make the staff of the first part conversant with the processes involved in teaching Logistics Courses.
- The first part shall depute its faculty members for participation in all training programmes conducted by the other part. Payment of nominal Participation Fee, and reimbursement of expenses for travel, boarding, & lodging of the deputed faculty members shall be taken care of by the first part. Certified True Copy

d. LSC commits that the Excess of Income over Expenditure under this Project, if any, would be used to strengthen education & training processes in Logistics Sector.

6. Payment Terms

- a. Payment for AAAP and other services shall be made by the first part to the other part at the rate of 10% of annual programme fee collected from each student during the three years of study or Rs.10,000 per student per year whichever is higher.
- b. This rate is applicable to students admitted in the Academic Year 2019-20. The other party reserves its right to revise the rate for future Batches of students in the light of cost involved for the process in consultation with the first part.
- c. The payment for AAAP shall be made online in single instalment before the first week of September every year.

7. Term & Termination

7.1. Term

- I. The agreement shall be valid for Five years, that is the term required for completion of the three-year UG programme by three consecutive batches of students admitted from the Academic Year 2019-20 and Calendar Year 2020.
- II. Validity of agreement shall be extended sufficiently early for further period/batches.

7.2. Termination

- The agreement might be revoked by the other party, if the first party violates any of the terms of this MoU.
- Students pursuing in the first party where the agreement was revoked, will be allotted by the other party to other Participating Institutions functioning the same region.

8. Force Majeure

- Force Majeure would include natural and unavoidable catastrophe that interrupts the expected course of events.
- b. The other part shall not be liable for penalty, liquidated damages or for default, if and to the extent that, its delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of Force Majeure.
- c. For purposes of this clause, "Force Majeure" means an event beyond the control of the other part and not involving other part and not involving the other part's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but are not restricted to, instances of, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes that might have an impact on the performance of the other party.

9. Resolution of Disputes

a. The first part and the other part shall make every effort to resolve amicably by direct informal negotiation, any disagreement or dispute. Arising between them under or in connection with this agreement.

b. Any dispute or difference whatsoever arising between the parties to this Agreement out of or relating to the construction, meaning, scope, operation or effect of this Agreement or the validity of the breach thereof, which cannot be resolved through the above mentioned method, shall be referred to a sole Arbitrator to be appointed by mutual consent of both the parties herein. If the parties cannot agree on the appointment of the Arbitrator within a period of one month from the notification by one party to the other of existence of such dispute, then the Arbitration shall be governed by NSDC. The provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 will be applicable and the award made thereunder shall be final and binding upon the parties hereto, subject to legal remedies available under the law. Such differences shall be deemed to be a submission to arbitration under the Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, or of any modifications, Rules or reenactments thereof. The Arbitration proceedings will be held at Chennai.

10. Effective Date of Agreement

This Agreement shall be with effect from the date of signing this agreement.

APPRENTICESHIP BASED UG DEGREE PROGRAMME

PROPOSAL FOR LAUNCHING COLLABORATIVE PROGRAMME FROM ACADEMIC YEAR 2019-20

Logistics Sector Skill Council (LSC), established by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) through National Skill Development Corporation of India (NSDC), has designed an Apprenticeship-based UG Degree Programme with the primary objective of creating adequate skills for gainful employment at supervisory / managerial levels in Logistics Industry.

The core focus of the above programmes is Skill Development, and hence nearly 60% of the programme component and duration constitute On-the Job Training in the form of Industry Apprenticeship.

Programme Details:

The UG Degree Programme consists of six Semesters (Three years). While the academic input is delivered in every Odd Semester, the practical component in the form of Apprenticeship Training is incorporated in Even Semesters.

The Programme Structure of the UG Degree Programme is built with

- 21 Papers at 7 per each Odd Semester
- 6 Practical papers at two per each Even Semester
- 3 industry-Certification courses at one in each Even Semester
- On-the-job Apprenticeship Training for 18 months (450 days) spread equally across the three Even Semesters. The OTJ in each Even Semester is considered equal to 3 Papers.

The participants of the Degree Programme would acquire adequate & appropriate skills making them fit for Supervisory / Managerial positions in Logistics Sector.

The Curriculum:

The model Curriculum Structure of the Degree programme developed by the Experts Committee constituted by LSC is given in the next page. The Experts Committee comprises both academia and industry executives. Documents on Programme Regulations, and Draft MoU would be shared with Universities that provide LSC a Letter of Intent for launching the collaborative programme from the ensuing Academic Year 2019-20. The Universities are encouraged to constitute a Board of Studies for this purpose, and to make few changes in the curriculum to suit their requirements.

Nomenclature:

The nomenclature of the Degree Programme can be either B.Com. (Logistics) or BBA (Logistics) or B.Sc. (Logistics). Universities may choose a particular nomenclature depending on the higher education scenario of the regions where they are located.

Batch Size & Fee:

Batch size and programme fee are left to the discretion of the participating institutions.

Implementation:

LSC is collaborating with many Universities that have high scores in NAAC Accreditation and/or NIRF Rating for launching the programme from the ensuing academic year 2019-20.

Students shall choose any ONE Course out of the TWO scheduled for Semesters II, IV, and VI.

Logistics Skill Council is responsible for effecting implementation of the program with the collaborating institutes in the form of

- academic support,
- support for securing paid apprenticeship for the students
- assessing performance of the students
- developing regional clusters of resource persons (both form Industry and Academia)
- · securing final placements for the students on successful completion of the degree programme

LSC has the validation from MSDE for developing Qualification packs and National Occupational standards (NOS) for various sub-sectors that come under logistics.

Jagannath University of Jaipur is the only collaborating Institution in Rajasthan and will be running BBA in logistics management with active, consistent and constant support from Logistics Skill Council.

A training program was help at New Delhi by the Logistics Skill Council with a view of handholding and developing specific skills of faculty members of collaborative Institutions in their efforts to teach Logistics Courses effectively.
